

In Benchmark we are learning about characters, story elements, verbs, and nouns! In ECRI we are learning more and more letters as well as learning to blend those letters together and begin reading.

In Math we are becoming more familiar with the numbers 1-10. This includes comparing numbers and making numbers. This will help us when we learn to add and subtract.

SECOND GRADE

2024

Happy November to all of our families! The weather is beginning to persistently be cold, so please be sure to send in a jacket without a hoodie for your child each day. A reminder that a healthy snack and water is also reccommended each school day as well.

We will soon be diving into Unit Three of Benchmark (our reading program) and talking about the government, different jobs within the government, and why it is important. In ECRI, we will be working on words with short and long u (cub, cube), along with r-controlled words (store, bird, hurt). In Science, we will be

continuing to work on the function of plants and animals in their habitats. In Math, we are continuing to add and subtract two-digit numbers with and without regrouping.

Please continue to check your child's homework folder each and every night. Homework is sent home each night (Monday through Thursday), along with weekly spelling words. There is always a spelling test on the weekly words every Friday. Thank you for your continued support this school year, and if anything is needed, always feel free to reach out via ParentSquare!

Happy November! It is hard to believe that we have completed the first marking period. In Reading we are continuing to reach our goals. Please continue to have children practice their fluency each night. All students need to remember to do their homework each week. We have been working on learning what an inference is, and how to write an opinion paper.

In Math, our focus is now on learning to multiply. Our students will be using models and strategies to solve multiplication facts and word problems. This month we will target the 0, 1, 2, 3, 5, and 10 times tables for memorization. Students receive a math homework assignment every Monday and it is due every Friday.

FOURTH GRADE

Hi everyone! It's hard to believe that we're in the 2nd marking period and that it's already fall! Here are a few updates about what we are working on in fourth grade in math, ELA, and science.

In math, students have begun Unit 2, which includes multiplication and division word problems, multiples, and factors, multi step problems, and shapes and patterns. Please make sure your child is completing their homework!

In ELA, students are currently working on Unit 2. The students are learning about how we reveal our selves to others and how an author develops characters by what they say and do. Please check out ParentSquare for weekly details in ELA.

Finally, in science, students are learning about waves! In this unit we will be learning about the parts of a wave, kinds of waves and how waves interact with matter. Please ask them about the hands on activities they are participating in. Thank you for all your support, and reach out if you have any questions!

Happy November! As we settle into this month, we have lots of exciting learning activities planned. Here's what's happening in our classrooms:

FIFTH GRADE

In math, we are focusing on reading and writing decimals. Please encourage your child to practice standard algorithms at home and to work on their fact fluency daily. We are also preparing to get started with Benchmark Unit 3, which will build on our skills!

In Unit 2, we've been learning about character traits through dialogue and actions, as well as improving our summarizing skills. Students are developing their ability to understand characters and their motivations in stories.

In science, we are exploring the concept of matter. Students will investigate the properties of solids, liquids, and gases and learn how matter can change from one state to another. Reminders:

- As it's getting chilly, please ensure your child comes to school in long-sleeve uniform shirts to stay warm during outdoor activities.

-Daily practice in math is essential for building confidence and skills, so please support your child in their homework and practice routines.Thank you for your continued support! If you have any questions or suggestions, feel free to reach out.

MRS. PRONOVOST **READING INTERVENTIONIST**

Our Intervention groups continue to practice their decoding skills by blending sounds together to make words. We also are working on fluency skills, such as: reading as if we are talking, with expression. Please know that Mrs. Pronovost's students have a plastic folder which should come to class and go home each day. The students come home with papers for practice and books to read. Please have your child read at least 10 minutes each night and complete the reading log in the plastic folder. I check these every Friday. Your child will receive a prize if the log is complete. Please ask your child about the folder, and the reading log, if you have not seen it.

All students have been working effortlessly in their small groups to improve their reading. Our students are placed in groups based on their individual needs. Your child is monitored monthly to assess the progress he/she is making and instruction is adjusted if necessary so we can ensure your child is progressing. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you are in need of reading materials at home. We will be more than happy to help you begin to build an at-home library for your child.

Unit 3 will be starting this month and we will be focusing on "Government and Citizenship". First grade will be answering, "Why do people get involved in their communities?". Fifth grade will be answering, "Why do laws continue to evolve?".

Please continue to ask your child about the stories he/she is reading in school and share some of your own storytelling. Storytelling builds vocabulary, enhances listening and communication skills, and helps to develop a sense of empathy. This month is a great time to tell stories about what we are grateful for and why

November 8th is National STEM Day. STEM Day is a day where we aim to inspire and encourage students to explore opportunities in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Through these core domains we hope to foster a love of learning and build curiosity in our young minds. On this date, your child will have the opportunity to take an ocean virtual field trip, to have a read aloud based on STEM, or do an activity that will engage them in STEM.

What's going on in math?

Kindergarten is learning to sort and count objects and count to 10.

First Grade is focusing on strategies for adding and subtracting.

Second Grade will use addition and subtraction strategies with two-digit numbers.

Third Grade is working hard on multiplication and multiplication facts.

Fourth Grade continues to work on multiples and factors and then will move on to multi-step problems.

Fifth Grade's focus is reading and writing decimals and then moving to rounding and comparing decimal numbers. How can you help your child with math?

At this time in the year it is very important for your child to be working on their basic math facts at their grade level. Make sure that their work area is quiet and organized so they can focus on their work. Lastly, make the time fun and enjoyable for you and your child.

Based on research, children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and first grade are less likely to read on grade level by the third grade. For older students, being chronically absent is strongly associated with low grades and students are more likely to drop out of high school. When students are consistently absent from school, not only do they run the risk of falling behind their peers academically, but they also exhibit poor self-esteem. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns. Regan School staff is willing to work together with you to help get your child to school daily and on time.

Did you know...



Put an end to procrastination by doing the crummy job first"

Your child has a math worksheet, a chapter to read and a writing assignment. If your child dislikes writing, recommend doing that assignment first. Here's why:

• Crummy jobs are a part of life.

We all have to do some things we don't like. Talk to your child about some of the jobs you don't enjoy doing, but have to do anyway. Doing laundry and cleaning the bathrooms every week isn't fun, but it is necessary hygiene.

- Putting off a difficult task just makes it more difficult. Until that assignment is finished, it's going to occupy your child's mind.
- Finishing a dreaded task feels wonderful. Help your child learn to focus on how great it will feel when the job is finished-not how crummy it will feel while doing it. Encourage your child to build in a small reward for finishing a challenging task, such as spending 10 minutes listening to music.

Sometimes, all it takes is a little push. Set a timer for 15 minutes and say, "Work on your writing for 15 minutes. Then you can stop." After getting started, it probably won't be as painful as your child anticipated.
