Dear Norwood Families and Residents:



Shepherd Chemical, one of our business partners, funds Norwood Ready Kids which provides parenting classes and programming for children starting from birth to age five. To get children off to a great start, the district offers preschool in our four elementary schools. We have both half and full day preschool offerings. Norwood has before and after school care through our Avenues for Success program that also provides an enriching summer camp. June through August.

We are proud of our walkable neighborhood schools which is very rare these days. All our beautiful historic buildings have been renovated with new HVAC systems and for 21st century learning, including technology – computers, chromebooks, interactive white boards and numerous software programs.

In addition to reading, writing, math, science and social studies, the elementary buildings offer art, music, physical education and STEM classes. At the middle school we expand our elective offerings to include more technology and pre-engineering courses. Our academic offerings at the high school include 11 advanced placement courses, gifted classes, engineering classes and the opportunity to attend the Great Oaks system for career tech. In recognition of some of our great programming, the district has received the 2024 Best Communities for Music Education award for our band, orchestra, show choir, jazz ensemble and general music program in our elementary schools.

To ensure our students are healthy physically and emotionally, we have a health center staffed with a nurse practitioner and a dentist who also accept appointments from community members. We have counselors in all our elementary schools, in addition to the high school and middle school. We also have mental health therapists from Talbert House and Perceptions Counseling, a school social worker, behavior specialist, and attendance officer to serve the needs of our students.

Norwood has a special organization that few districts have. It is our Norwood Scholarship Foundation, which is the culmination of 70 years of Norwood pride. The fund was started by a retired teacher's savings in 1962 and invested over the years. The foundation provided \$275,000 dollars to our graduating seniors last year, to pay for college. Families and students are very grateful to receive this help with college tuition.

The district is surrounded by great partners allowing us to provide a comprehensive program and many opportunities for our families before they enroll with us, and support after they leave us. That is what makes Norwood schools and the entire community special. Welcome to a new school year.

We have made great strides to reduce costs and still provide that high quality education for each child enrolled at Norwood City Schools. I'm proud to say that our current budget of \$30 M is comparable to our 2019 budget of \$30 M. In essence, we have saved inflationary growth during that five year period. We constantly trim budgets in order to remain financially stable and will continue to watch for ways to reduce spending for our taxpayers.


We refunded bonds in 2021, reducing direct payments from our taxpayers by more than \$3.4 million over the life of the bonds! This spring, the Hamilton County Auditor reduced bond millage again, dropping our original voted bond millage from 4.5 to 2 mills! This means that property taxes have been reduced for the bond levy over the past few years.

We have finished our building renovation project originally titled "Warm, Safe, and Dry," under budget and on time. All of our beautiful century old buildings are fully renovated with new HVAC systems including air conditioning, new lighting, new drop off lanes, handicap accessible updates, historically accurate window replacements and other great improvements. We are recognizing utility cost savings due to these upgrades.

As the district has saved money from construction updates and through ESSER grant funding, we are continuing updates to our facilities including the Shea Stadium remodel, a beautification project including new playgrounds, and upgrades to our Middle School auditorium to showcase our fantastic fine arts programs.

As always, the safety of our staff and students is first followed by transparent and fiscally responsible finances. The Five-Year Forecast provides the district's estimated financial trend over time and a roadmap for decisions aimed at encouraging financial sustainability and stability.

Our goal every year is to ensure that Everybody is in school Every Day!

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life.

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school—regardless of the reason—it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is chronically absent—which means missing as little at 1-2 days per month which can be 18 or more days over the course of an entire school year. Research shows:

- Children chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade.
- By 6th grade, chronic absence is a proven early warning sign for students at risk for dropping out of school.
- By 9th grade good attendance can predict graduation rates even better than 8th grade test scores.

Absences can add up quickly. A child is chronically absent if he or she misses just two days every month!!

Clearly, going to school regularly matters!

We don't want your child to fall behind in school and get discouraged. Please ensure that your child attends school every day and arrives on time. Here are a few practical tips to help support regular attendance:

- Make sure your children keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Ensure your children go to school every day unless they are truly sick
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school is in session.
- Talk to teachers and counselors for advice if your children feel anxious about going to school.
- Develop back up plans for getting to school if something comes up.
 Call on a family member, neighbor, or another parent to take your child to school.

Learning starts before Kindergarten. Ninety percent of a child's brain develops by age 3! Norwood Ready Kids is a collaborative effort aimed at ensuring all Norwood children come to school ready to learn. There is something for every family with a birth to preschool-aged child. Through partnership with local Norwood businesses, the Norwood community has access to programs that build kindergarten readiness in our children.

- Parents with prenatal up to 3-year-old children can participate in Every Child Succeeds. ECS helps parents create a nurturing environment with a focus on healthy development and early learning.
- Parents or trusted caregivers can participate in Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters. HIPPY is a home-based familyfocused program that helps parents provide educational enrichment for 2 to 5-year-olds.
- 4C for Children helps young families find quality childcare. They also can help someone secure training to become a quality-rated childcare provider. And, 4C for Children facilitates one of our parent groups called **Strong Families** for adults with 0 to 12-year-olds.

Parents Right to Know

Parents Right to Know: You have the right to know about the teaching qualifications of your child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds. The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires that any school district receiving Title I funds must notify parents of each student attending any school receiving Title I funds that they may request, and the district will provide the parents on request (and in a timely manner), information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers, including at a minimum, the following: I. Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction; II. Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; and III. Whether the teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher; IV. Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications. You may ask for the information by contacting Mary Ronan, at 513-924-2500 for further information.

Federal Funds

Annually, the Norwood City School District applies for use of federal funds (Title I, Title II-A, Title III, Title IV and Title VI-B and ECSE) and ESSER funds through grant applications. The Norwood City School District is participating in a statewide effort to identify, locate and evaluate all children with disabilities from birth to age 21. Many children who

need preschool classes have unidentified disabilities. For children from birth to age 2, a disability means that a child has a delay in one or more of the following areas: communication, cognitive ability, adaptive behavior, physical development, or social/emotional development.

For children ages 3 through 5 years old, a disability means that a child has a significant deficit in one or more of the following areas: communication skills, hearing, vision, motor functioning, adaptive behavior, or cognitive ability. For school-age children, a handicapping condition means having an identified handicap of the following conditions: orthopedic/health, speech and language, severe behavior, learning disabilities, developmental, hearing or visual, autism, or traumatic brain injury.

Applications for Transportation Reimbursement

Applications are available by calling 513-924-2500. Qualifications: Your child must attend a non-public school recognized by the State of Ohio; live 2 miles or more from the school; attend grades K-8; and be a Norwood resident.

Asbestos Management Program

In October 22, 1986, President Reagan signed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA, Public Law 99-519). The act required the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to develop regulations for addressing asbestos in public and private elementary and secondary schools. On October 30, 1987, the EPA published the Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule (40 CFR Part 763 Subpart E). This rule stipulated, and our district has complied with, the following key requirements:

- Identification of asbestos-containing materials in all school buildings.
- Development and implementation of asbestos management plans for each school.
- Regular surveillance and inspections of the condition of asbestos in the buildings.
- Designation and training of a person to oversee asbestos activities within the district and to ensure compliance with the regulations.

This memorandum is to advise you the asbestos management plans for the district schools were developed following the EPA ruling and subsequently approved by the State of Ohio, Department of Health. These plans are regularly updated and are available for you to review.

Should you have any questions regarding this program or would like to review an asbestos management plan, please contact the Board of Education offices during normal business hours.

Section 504 of the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 ADAAA

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 requires a public school district to identify each child who has a disability that substantially limits a major life function such as learning, eating, sleeping, etc. If you believe your child's health condition substantially limits a major life function, he/she may qualify for an evaluation to determine Section 504 eligibility. Notice of monitoring of district-issued devices

The Norwood City School District may access and/or monitor students' activity on school issued devices for prevention and safety purposes, as long as the district provides an annual notice to parents.
