Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE)

ECFE is a program for parents/quardians and their children during the years from birth through prekindergarten. It is based on the idea that parents/quardians provide their child's first and most significant learning environment and are the child's first and most important teachers. We work to support you as a parent/caregiver and to strengthen families. In District 196, we also offer classes for parents with children up to third grade in order to support continued parent engagement in children's learning and development. A typical ECFE class includes:

- Parent-child interaction: Time together to enjoy a classroom filled with developmentally appropriate learning activities.
- Parent education: Relevant, effective education and support that encourage the growth and development of families.
- Early childhood education: Children explore, gain independence and practice social skills with the guidance of a licensed early childhood teacher.

Our ECFE program also offers one-time weekly events for parents and children to enjoy together, including Family and Baby Playtimes. See page 4 and the back cover for details.

The Minnesota Children's **Outdoor Bill of Rights**

'All Minnesota children have a right to start or participate in an urban, community or personal garden or farm.'

If you don't have a lot of space, all you need is one flower pot to start a garden! You can plant easy-to-grow vegetables like lettuce or flowers. Taking care of a garden is a great way to foster responsibility, patience and a connection with the natural world.

Try this: Plant a sunflower and track the growth over the Summer. Take pictures of your child standing beside it for reference, or use a tape measure. In the Fall, your child can practice their fine motor skills while removing the seeds.

Go Exploring!

Let's Get Cooking! Create Your Own 'Mud' Kitchen

Providing children with old pots, pans and kitchen utensils to play with outdoors is a great way to foster their imaginative play. They can gather natural materials (rocks, sticks, pinecones, etc.) to pretend to cook and bake. No actual 'kitchen' is needed. A tree stump, a wood board or even a chalk-drawn stovetop on the sidewalk will do.

Mud is optional! If you are someone who can embrace the mess, allowing children to make and play with mud provides a wonderful sensory experience.

Put dirt in one bucket, water in another bucket and provide a bowl for mixing. Beware of potting soil mixed with fertilizers-use topsoil instead. Providing different sized measuring utensils (cups, spoons) will provide an opportunity for children to explore different units of measurement.

Adopt a Drain

Do you have a storm drain in your neighborhood? Help keep our rivers, lakes and wetlands clean by keeping the storm drain free of debris. Spend just 15 minutes two times per month checking the top of the drain for leaves, sticks and trash. By removing these items, you are keeping pollutants out of the water. Spring Flower Playdough

Ingredients

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- · 1 cup water
- 1/4 cup salt
- 2 tsp cream of tartar
- Food coloring
- · Rose water (taste-safe) or flower-scented oils (lilac, jasmine, rose or geranium)
- Real flower petals

In a saucepan add the flour, salt, water, and cream of tartar along with a few drops of the food coloring and a drop or two of the rose water or flower-scented oil.

Stir well until everything is combined. It will still look a bit lumpy, but that is okay.

Place the saucepan over low heat.

Keep stirring and the mixture will begin to thicken, forming into one large ball.

Place the ball of dough on parchment or wax paper and leave to cool for a few minutes.

When it is cool enough to handle, knead the dough until it is less lumpy and more pliable like playdough.
