Major Maintenance Updates

The district currently has \$300+ million in maintenance needs, including several major projects across schools in the Cherokee Trail feeder. Examples include:

- New roof & flooring (Cherokee Trail HS)
- New flooring (Black Forest Hills, Buffalo Trail, Canyon Creek & Fox Ridge)
- Playground upgrades (Pine Ridge, Coyote Hills)

Feeder Overview

Newest feeder in the district, home to:

- 8,800 students (approx.)
- 7 elementary schools
- 2 middle schools
- Cherokee Trail High School
- Legacy Stadium

Recent Investments

- Woodland Elementary School (2022)
- Altitude Elementary School (2018)
- Infinity Middle School (2018)
- New Innovation Space (2020) and addition to Cherokee Trail High School (2012)
- New track and tennis field; new football field at Legacy Stadium (2016)
- Secure vestibules at every school (2020)
- New gym floors at Pine Ridge, Coyote Hills, Black Forest Hills & others (2020)

Cherry Creek Innovation Campus 2.0

Expand CCIC to accommodate 70% more students and develop/expand 10 pathways:

- Mechatronics
- Avionics
- Creative (Film, Editing, Sound, Production)
- EMT
- Vet Tech
- HVAC
- Welding
- Events Center / expansion of Culinary
- Automotive (expansion)
- Aerospace Manufacturing (expansion)



Current CCIC Pathways:

- Business Services
- Health & Wellness
- Hospitality & Tourism

- Transportation (Automotive & Aviation)



Estimated Timeline

- Concept plan complete; in design phase
- Construction could begin in January 2025 upon voter approval

Safety & Security

Safety and security is our number one priority. We continue to prioritize investments in trained security personnel and safety upgrades to school buildings.

In the 2024 bond package, every school building would receive:

- Ballistic Window Film
- Security Camera Replacement
- Access Control System Replacement

Why now?

- 75-year-old district comes with aging buildings
 - 68 out of 89 buildings are 20+ years old
 - 21 schools are 40+ years old
- Continuing inflation and construction costs
- Protecting and maximizing taxpayer investment in community assets
