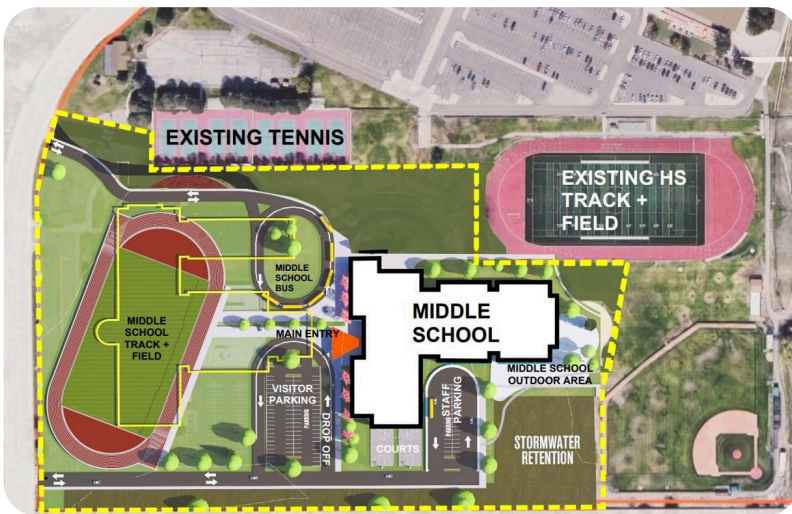


Smoky Hill Feeder Bond Projects



Laredo Middle School/Smoky Hill High School Campus Updates



- Rebuild Laredo Middle School (constructed in 1974) to meet today's student and programmatic needs
- Upgrade Smoky Hill High School athletic facilities
- Projects are initial phase of master planning process to rebuild and renew campus



Feeder Overview

Second oldest campus in the district, home to:

- 7,000 students (approx.)
- 8 elementary schools
- 2 middle schools
- Smoky Hill High School (constructed in 1975)

Estimated Timeline

- Master planning underway; decisions remain about design, traffic flow, etc.
- Construction could begin in Summer 2025

Community Outreach

- Public listening sessions, stakeholder interviews & online survey
- Initial concepts shared with community

Cherry Creek Innovation Campus 2.0

Expand CCIC to accommodate 70% more students and develop/expand 10 pathways:

- Mechatronics
- Avionics
- Creative (Film, Editing, Sound, Production)
- EMT
- Vet Tech
- HVAC
- Welding
- Events Center / expansion of Culinary
- Automotive (expansion)
- Aerospace Manufacturing (expansion)



Current CCIC Pathways:

- Advanced Manufacturing
- Business Services
- Health & Wellness
- Hospitality & Tourism
- Infrastructure Engineering
- IT & STEAM
- Transportation (Automotive & Aviation)



Estimated Timeline

- Concept plan complete; in design phase
- Construction could begin in January 2025 upon voter approval

Safety & Security

Safety and security is our number one priority and we continue to prioritize investments in trained security personnel and safety upgrades to school buildings.

In the 2024 proposed bond, every school building would receive:

- Ballistic Window Film
- Security Camera Replacement
- Access Control System Replacement

Why now?

- 75-year-old district comes with aging buildings
 - 68 out of 89 buildings are 20+ years old
 - 21 schools are 40+ years old
- Continuing inflation and construction costs
- Protecting and maximizing taxpayer investment in community assets
