- Southside High School has a website at www.fortsmithschools.org/southside. This website contains information about our school's mission and history, academics, faculty, events, extracurricular activities, and policies.

- Administrators, counselors, and teachers email addresses are on the school's website and can also be accessed through the Home Access Center.

- Teachers communicate with parents by email, notes, and phone calls as situations arise. Parents and teachers frequently communicate through email.

Parents and teachers may schedule conferences as needed.

The school also uses ParentLink, school newsletters, Remind, Facebook, Twitter, and the school website to publish announcements.

- Open House is an introduction to the school's teachers and content. Parents are able to visit each of their child's classes to meet teachers on Open House within the first two weeks of the school year. The date will be announced using a wide range of social media. Other information obtained during open house includes: a report on the state of the school, Title 1 information, and an overview of the Southside student handbook.

- The Fort Smith School District utilizes a learning management system called Schoology. This program allows parents to view student's course information including grades on a daily basis.

- The faculty at Southside High School use Schoology as their learning management system. Schoology contains information in reference to the individual courses. Parents may view student grades, presentations, notes and curriculum utilizing Schoology.

- Teachers will post on Schoology, class information including a class syllabus each year or semester based on the course.

- Two parent teacher conferences are held each year. Southside High School fall conferences for 2023 will be held on October 16th and October 19th, 2023. Spring conferences for 2024 will be held at Southside High School on March 11th and March 14th, 2024. Conferences will be from 3:30-6:30 in the evening. If this time doesn't fit a parent's schedule, they may meet with teachers at another arranged time.

- Report cards and mid-term grades are sent to parents on a scheduled basis determined by the district.

- Southside High School has a Parent Teacher Student Association that is involved throughout the school year (chaperone dances, sponsor fall festival and spring fling). Four PTSA meetings are held during the school year in combination with a large school event.

- The PTSA has an opportunity for students to be involved in providing input to the school. The PTSA student board is also part of the Principal's Advisory Board. The board is determined by an application process and is open to ALL students in grades 9-12.

At the beginning of the year, every family is given access to the school handbook digitally and provided with a printed format available on request which contains information about Southside's policies and procedures. Each family also receives a school calendar, which shows athletic and extracurricular activities for students and parents.

- Southside High School has 2 Parent Resource Centers that are located in both the Freshman Office and the main office. The center provides information about programs and resources with-in the community that provides support services to families. Materials to assist parents in their child's academic achievements are in the center, as well as Page 3 of 13

materials that involve the growth and development of adolescence and related adolescent issues (drug use, depression, etc). Materials are available for checkout. The parents are made aware of the center and its contents in the updates sent from the principal.

- Standardized test results are sent home and the counselors serve as a resource to help parents interpret scores.
- Southside High School band, athletics, drama, choir, and orchestra have supportive Booster Clubs that are composed of parent volunteers.
- Classes at SHS invite parents and community leaders to be guest speakers about various topics and their careers.

*The counseling department will schedule a Senior Parent Night each year that will be announced to parents on social media, using Remind, and in Schoology. During this meeting, parents and senior students will learn how to access their Naviance account to search for scholarships, FAFSA, ACT, and other vital information necessary for their college and career planning.

*Cafecitos - These are small-group meetings for our Hispanic parents that are conducted in their native language. These meetings cover general information about school and also about post-secondary opportunities for our students. The first Cafecito is scheduled for September 5, 2023 to cover the topic "How to help with homework". The second Cafecito will be January 23, 2024 and will cover the topic "Testing preparation and stress". Both Cafecitos will be announced on SHS social media and flyers will be sent home with the students. All families are invited and encouraged to attend.
