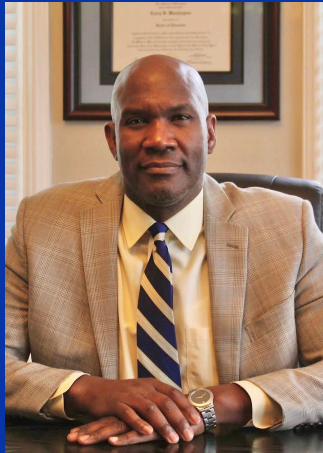

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FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

We are so thankful for the tremendous support the Washingtonville community has given our school district. It is this support that has made the Washingtonville Central School District and Wizard Nation so great. After lengthy discussions and planning throughout this school year, we have put together another responsible budget as well as three bond propositions. One to purchase five buses and two bond propositions for a Capital Project that improves the learning environment for our students in significant ways at a very reasonable cost to taxpayers. We are “futureproofing” our school district. **Polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. on May 21 at the Washingtonville High School gymnasium.** We encourage you to learn the details about the budget and bond propositions on our website at

2024-25 BUDGET: The \$129,056,416 proposed budget for the 2024-25 school year reflects a 3.27% tax levy increase, the total amount of local taxes that support the budget is within the allowable limits set by the New York State tax levy calculation, or “tax cap” as it is more commonly known. The school district has been operating within its calculated state tax cap every year since the cap was implemented in 2012. The budget shows an investment in teachers, instructional programs, student services, curriculum development, and instructional technology. All of which are critical to achieving the school district’s Priority Areas – Student Experience, Academic Excellence and Communication Connection, which were explained in the last newsletter and can be found at www.wcsdk12.org/district/mission. The budget also allows for increases in salaries and benefits due to contractual obligations and changes in enrollment, inflation for products and services like utilities and transportation, the September expiration of pandemic stimulus funding that will shift some staffing costs to the general fund, the new BOCES capital project and unfunded mandates by the state.

CAPITAL PROJECT: We are also very excited to present our proposed Capital Project to the voters this year. Providing a safe, healthy, and meaningful educational experience has always been a top priority of the school administration and Board of Education. This capital project is designed to enhance the physical and mental well-being of our students, faculty, and community as a whole through improvements to our educational, support, and athletic spaces. Our proposed capital project is intended to improve the academic environment for our students. The project encompasses several key components, including infrastructure, upgrades and renovations, health and safety measures, renovations to the pool area, enhancements to multipurpose fields, upgrades to heating systems, and improvements in security. For several years, our district has prioritized long-term financial planning that can support a capital project while minimizing the burden to our taxpayers. Through a combination of funds saved in the voter-approved capital reserve, bonding, and State Building Aid to cover a portion of eligible project costs.

ODYSSEY OF THE MIND TEAMS IN WORLD FINALS

Washingtonville High School and Washingtonville Middle School Odyssey of the Mind teams, who won in the state competition in April, advanced to the World Finals competition in Ames, Iowa on May 21-24! The teams will compete against international teams for a chance to win a gold medal. The WMS team is a Problem 3 team and competed against 19 other teams in states to place first. Problem 3 consists of students writing and performing original theatrical performances based on a work from classical literature, artwork, music, culture, or history. WHS is a Problem 4 team. This is their second year competing and winning in the state competition. One of the key factors of Problem 4 is "Structure," which requires team members to engineer something that can hold hundreds of pounds of weight. The structure, made of balsa wood, has to weigh only 15 grams. The team created a set to hold 596 pounds!



WCSD A BEST COMMUNITY FOR MUSIC EDUCATION

The National Association of Music Merchants organization (also known as NAMM) has recognized Washingtonville Central School District for their 2024 - Best Communities for Music Education Award. This national award is given to school districts for their outstanding commitment to music education. This is the 11th year in a row that Washingtonville CSD has received this honor. To qualify for the Best Communities for Music Education Award, WCSD answered detailed questions about funding, graduation requirements, music class participation, instruction time, facilities, support for the music program, and community music-making programs.
