Physical Education



Union Park has implemented email office hours and a “curfew” to ensure that we maintain a healthy work-life balance. We will check/respond to emails Monday through Friday from 7:00am to 8:00am, during our scheduled prep times, and again from 3:00-5:00pm.

If you would like to meet with us, please schedule specific times to meet, as we need time to communicate effectively. I often have professional duties directly before and after school hours. Please understand that I will not be able to meet or discuss issues while I am teaching or supervising students. However, we will contact you as soon as we can.

Physical Education Schedule

- Union Park Special Area classes operate on a rotating 6 day schedule. Students have specific days their classroom will attend PE. For example, Mr. Smith’s 2nd grade class attends PE on days 1, 3, & 5, Art on day 2, Spanish on day 4, and Music on day 6.
- **When attending PE, students are expected to be dressed appropriately to participate in physical activity, wear proper footwear, and should bring a water bottle.**
- Union Park Physical Education teaches to the AZ State Standards using a variety of methods to engage students in the learning of physical education, activity, wellness, teamwork, strategy, and sportsmanship/citizenship.

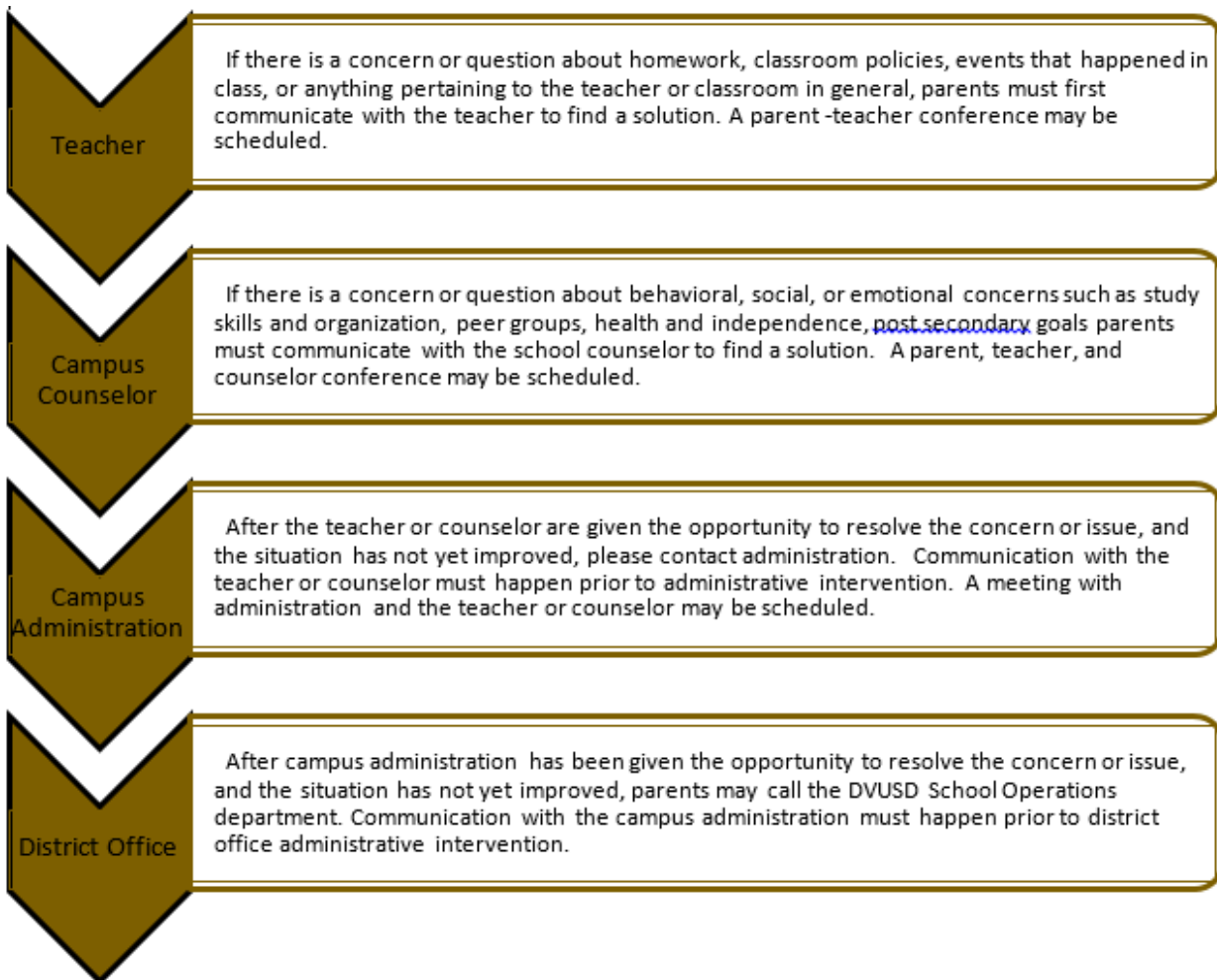

Communication

Parent Involvement is all about the children. Participation in your child's education is proven to boost his or her achievement in school. We are committed to treat parents as partners while keeping lines of communication open and focused on the needs of your child. Mutual trust and respect between parents and teachers is required to maintain a positive learning experience at any school. We believe that your trust in Union Park is required to ensure your child's success.

Stakeholder communication plays an important role in the success of a school. Solutions are best found at the level closest to the issue or concern. As such, we have adopted the following protocol.



If a child's safety or school-wide safety is a concern, please contact the front office or a staff member immediately. Administration works diligently to ensure the safety of all students.

Please schedule specific times to meet with your child's teacher, as he or she needs time to communicate effectively. Teachers often have professional duties directly before and after school hours.



Behavioral Expectations

All District Rules will be adhered to at Union Park School. Please refer to the DVUSD Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook. We believe that students must treat others with the same respect with which they are treated by the adults in our school. We also believe that student's actions, dress, possessions, etc., must not cause a problem for themselves or anyone else.

Every attempt is made to contact parents to discuss school problems before the student arrives home.

Grades

Grades are a reporting tool utilized to reflect what a student knows and is able to do in a content area. We measure achievement of standards in our grading system. Grades will be recorded using an E,S,N,U / percentage scale for each standard being taught, and the average of those scores will determine the student's overall grade.

Union Park PE: Union Park physical education uses a standards based mindset. All grades will be based on scoring rubrics matched to assessments, coursework, and practice.

PowerSchool is an essential resource for parents and students. It is not only a tool for communication regarding grades, it is a resource for our students and parents to check progress, missing work, and what is being taught/learned regularly. Please ensure that you and your child have access and even sign up for the app and push notifications or weekly email updates as an option in [PowerSchool](#).

Grading Scale

Students in Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grades will receive marks for their **proficiency** towards the grade level standards using the following scale.


- 4 = Applies grade level skills with greater depth or complexity
- 3 = Demonstrates grade level proficiency
- 2 = Approaches grade level proficiency
- 1 = Displays a significant lack of grade level proficiency

Students in 1st and 2nd grades will receive marks for their **overall performance** in each course of study using the following letter grade scale. Overall course grades for students in 1st and 2nd grades will be determined by the average of all overall standards scores for the grading period. The average will be converted to a letter grade of E, S, N, or U.

- E = Excellent (87%-100%)
- S = Satisfactory (58%-86%)
- N = Needs Improvement (42%-57%)
- U = Under Performing (0%-41%)

Example Rubric for a PE Standard

S1.E10 1st Grade Manipulatives <i>Underhand throw</i>	
4	Steps with the opposite foot while demonstrating at least 4 or more of the 5 critical elements of mature pattern for an underhand throw.
3	Demonstrates 4 of the 5 critical elements of mature pattern for an underhand throw, but may include missing the action of stepping with the opposite foot.
2	Demonstrates 3 of the 5 critical elements of mature pattern for an underhand throw.
1	Demonstrates 2 or less of the 5 critical elements of mature pattern for an underhand throw.



Gradebook Guidelines

- Teachers are to maintain students' grades and progress on the District's electronic grade book program.
- Teacher grade books are auditable documents and are maintained digitally by network services.
- Every effort is made to record a minimum of one grade per week for each content area. The first week of school, district-wide assessments, and state testing weeks are allowable exceptions.
- Gradebooks are updated on a weekly basis.
- **No "extra credit" will be given at any time.**
- Progress reports will be sent home for students halfway through the quarter.

Student's Role in Learning

Students become self-directed in learning about themselves as a learner. They have to analyze their own study habits to figure out what actually works for them, this helps students retain knowledge.
