LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 have enjoyed their Maths lessons this week. The children have been learning how to read and work out word problems in their addition topic. They enjoyed writing their own word problems for their friends to answer. In Art, the children have learnt about the colour wheel and have been mixing colours to create their own colour wheels.

Ask me: What is the colour wheel?







Year 2 have been learning about famous explorers such as Christopher Columbus. In P.E, we practiced our 'flashy passing' skills. This included underarm and overarm throws. In English, we have continued reading The Last Wolf and have spent time understanding the characters' thoughts and feelings.

Ask me: Why is Christopher Columbus famous?



Year 3 have had an incredibly busy week. At the start of the week, they finished their DT project Cook well, Eat well by making four different taco fillings and then choosing their favourite combination to add to their taco to take home to enjoy. They have done some fantastic writing based on their class book James and the Giant Peach and tackled some tricky addition and subtraction in maths using place value counters. They have also enjoyed PE this week, learning to do different rolls in gymnastics and getting their heart rate up with circuits on Friday.

Ask me: When do you need to exchange during addition or subtraction?



Year 4 began with a trip to Windsor Castle to take part in the Remembrance Service. Year 4 walked to and from the castle with the reception children and were incredibly sensible. The Year 4 children are enjoying the responsibilities of being the oldest children in the school. Each Friday this term they are reading with the reception children. They have spent time learning some of their own favourite short stories. They have story mapped the stories so that they can become familiar with them and learn sections off by heart. The children have also worked on their story reading skills, adding pace, volume and enthusiasm.

Ask me: Which story have you been reading to the children in reception?



Reception have been learning about moving machines this week. We have really enjoyed reading our story Car, Car, Truck, Jeep which we have read to the tune of baa baa black sheep and the children have enjoyed learning the story and reciting different parts. We have discussed emergency vehicles and those used on farms. We have finished this week by creating observational drawings of our favourite moving machine and had a go at using our phonic knowledge to write the name.

Ask me: What is your favourite moving machine and why?

Autism Sensory Bus

Throughout the remainder of November and all of December a new sensory bus, for autistic children, will be attending multiple Christmas events throughout Maidenhead. They will be offering an autism friendly Santa's Grotto and sensory room bookings to provide a safe space and calming experience for children who may be feeling overwhelmed at the event so they and their families can attend – inclusion for all.

From January 2025, they will be trialling the bus termly with schools so they can offer a sensory room facility onsite for schools that currently are unable to offer this support to children with autism currently. They are also in the planning stage to offer hair cuts and counselling in the bus sensory room environment.
