Woolwich Twp. – Representatives from the South Jersey Quilts of Valor Foundation participated in *Kingsway's 4th Annual Veterans Day Breakfast* on Friday, November 15, 2024, where they presented hand-made Quilts of Valor to Kingsway employees who have served in the United States Armed Forces. This year's honorees were Bus Driver Henry Olinsky (U.S. Army) and School Resource Officer Billy Franklin (U.S. Marine Corps).

About Henry Olinsky

Henry has served as a school bus driver for Kingsway since 2012 and is being recognized for his outstanding service. He served in the U.S.



Army from 1974 to 1978 with the 1st Battalion, 12th Infantry, and the 82nd Airborne Division. His distinguished military career includes roles as a paratrooper, expert rifleman, and jungle warfare expert, embodying the dedication and courage that define the U.S. Army. Henry's service during the Cold War era contributed to securing the legacy of these elite units.

About Billy Franklin

Officer Franklin, one of our devoted school resource officers, served in the United States Marine Corps from 1984 to 1988. He participated in *Operation El Dorado Canyon and the Freedom of Navigation Exercises*, which involved airstrikes against Libya in response to the 1986 bombing of a West Berlin nightclub. His service exemplifies the courage and resolve of the U.S. Armed Forces, and we are proud to recognize him as an integral member of our school community.
