# **Highlights from the State of the School Address**

Last Monday was our 6<sup>th</sup> annual virtual State of the School Address. This address provides the opportunity for school leadership to update our community on JPII's program, finances, and plans for the future. It also officially kicks off our reenrollment season for current students. While many of you tuned in live, the address was recorded and is on the JPII Facebook page for viewing at your convenience.

The first major highlight I would like to stress is our projected enrollment for next year and the likelihood of JPII being at capacity for the first time in its short history. With no plans for additional modular classrooms, we expect to hit our enrollment capacity in the 420's. The exact number is dependent on enrollment by grade. Each year we prepare an enrollment projection for budgeting and planning purposes. This projection is based on three-year trend data incorporating year-to-year retention as well as new students. Each grade is calculated separately. As you can see below, the projection of 439 students will likely mean we will not have room for every student who wishes to attend. This assumes a retention rate of 90%, our three-year average.

#### The Cost to Educate

We determine tuition each year based on the cost to educate model. That is determined by calculating a preliminary budget with assumptions. A preliminary budget is not a final one but rather a projection. The primary factors that influence cost to educate are inflationary pressures, currently running about 2.5%, compensation for faculty and staff, anticipated program costs, and debt service.

The projected cost to educate for the 2025-26 school year is \$17,320. This includes \$15,639 for operational costs and \$1,681 for debt service. We increased debt this year by \$3.2 million by completing Phase I of the campus expansion plan (guardhouse and security, parking lot, soccer field, storage building, and landscaping). We did not incur debt on the Commons renovation and patio, instead using cash from the capital campaign.

Therefore, based on the cost to educate, tuition for high school will be \$17,300 and for middle school will be \$15,300. The primary cost difference between middle and high schools is due to number of course offerings, staffing, and average class size. A family who is an active member of a Beaufort Deanery parish receives a \$1,500 discount off this tuition due to the subsidy we receive from the parish. Over 70% of our students are registered as Catholic. To soften this increase for families with multiple children, we increased the 2<sup>nd</sup> child discount from \$500 to \$750 and the 3<sup>rd</sup> child discount from \$500 to \$1,000. Bus transportation fees will remain as is. Over \$800,000 in tuition assistance and scholarships are available allowing us to meet the financial needs of families and keep the school affordable to a wide range of students.

When you compare JPII's tuition to other schools you realize the value of what you are getting. We have more academic offerings and more extracurricular activities than all these other schools. While our tuition is still expensive, it is below average. Our program is anything but below average.

#### **Reenrollment is Now Open**

In years past, the urgency to reenroll at JPII was nonexistent. We had the space to accommodate late enrollees. That space will likely be gone next year. Applications for next year are already trending higher than previous years. That means the demand is high and the supply will be low. We will not be able to enroll every student next year who wants a JPII education. An email was sent on Tuesday to alert you to the process, which is the same as in years past. A \$500 non-refundable per student deposit is required to secure your spot for next year. If you are receiving tuition assistance or scholarships, please submit that application (it must be

done each year) through FACTS. All of this must be done no later January 31. After that date we will begin accepting new students and awarding financial aid.
