School Values and Expectations



Oakley School launched the Values and Expectations this half term, which have been carefully considered by staff and Year 7 and 8 pupils. At Myton Gardens we believe these Values and Expectations encompass all the things that sit at the heart of a successful school, community and individual. The expectations, known as the Three Rs, *Respectful*, *Ready to Learn* and *Responsible*, ensure all our pupils feel safe and understand what is expected of them, their peers and the adults around them. This ensures children are accountable for their actions within a restorative and supportive environment where we learn from each other. Similarly, the values, *Kindness*, *Confidence* and *Resilience*, ensure children strive to ***be the best that they can be!***

To support our younger children in gaining better understanding of what they all mean, we have developed some stickers that will be awarded to children when they display any of the six areas. If your child comes home proudly showcasing one of these stickers on their uniform, please chat with them about why they received it and celebrate their achievements!

Our Phase and Class Assemblies will focus on further understanding these areas, our Celebration Assemblies awards 2 children each week for displaying them, and we will have a focus Value and Expectation each half term. As we are now into the second half of Autumn Term we are focussing on both being ***Respectful*** and having ***Confidence***.

We look forward to sharing more about how we promote these Values and Expectations throughout the year.

School Houses and Achievement Points

Children in Reception have now been placed into one of our school Houses and you can view your child's house on their profile on the MCaS app. The Houses, *Admiral*, *Peacock* and *Meadow* were chosen by staff and last year's Year 7 Oakley pupils, as they are some of the most common butterflies found in our beautiful Oakley Woods. All children across the school are placed into Houses and will partake in activities and events with their House throughout the course of the year. More information will follow in due course.

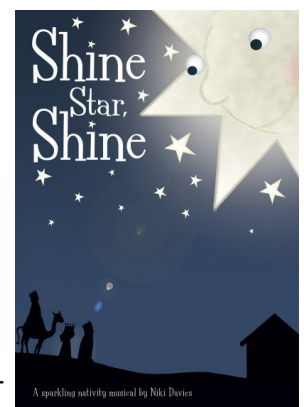
