

Reminder about Scarborough's Safe Storage Resolution

In May, 2023, the Scarborough School Board and Town Council collectively passed <u>Resolution 23-001</u>, focusing on Gun Safety. I am writing to you to today as a reminder of this resolution, as hunting season approaches and as an annual reminder to each of you of the critical importance of proper gun storage. It is our collective responsibility to prevent firearm violence and protect our children, homes, schools, and neighborhoods from the tragedy that the discharge of a firearm can cause. Safe firearm storage is a key step in achieving this goal. By securely storing firearms, we can prevent access by children and teens who might unintentionally or intentionally harm themselves or others. More than 4 million children live in homes with unlocked, loaded firearms, putting them at risk. Studies show that securely storing both firearms and ammunition significantly reduces the risk of injury or death among children and teens.

Safe firearm storage helps prevent unnecessary harm. Here are some key actions that everyone can take:

- Store Firearms Unloaded: Keep firearms in a locked, tamper-proof cabinet or safe that children or unauthorized adults cannot access.
- Store Ammunition Separately: Keep ammunition in a locked container, separate from firearms.
- Use Safety Locks: Employ trigger locks or cable locks to prevent accidental firing.

By following these steps and educating children about the dangers of firearms, we can help prevent tragic accidents. Scarborough Public Schools is committed to ensuring the safety of our students and community. Together, we can reduce firearm-related injuries and deaths and protect those we care about. Thank you for your partnership in this critical effort.


News from the SPS Nutrition Department about Nutrislice




Did you know the Nutrislice technology that provides all of your child/ren's school digital menus, can now be translated into a number of different languages. Ukrainian and French to name a few?




