Updates to HHIHS Dress Code Policy

Beaufort County School District has a Dress Code policy in place for all schools.

When students are out of dress code they are sent to the front office. If a student's shirt violates the dress code, they are given a HHIHS shirt to change into. If a student's bottom attire violates dress code they are given a pair of pants, shorts or sweatpants that are in compliance with the dress code. The expectation is that the student will return the top or bottom at the end of the school day (the clothes are then washed so they can be used again). If this does not happen an obligation is assessed to the student. However, due to students not returning the clothes at the end of the day our supply of clothes is nearly gone.

At this time, we are ordering more clothes (shirts and sweatpants) to be used for students who violate the dress code. Going forward, we will place an obligation of \$10 for a top and \$10 for a bottom each and every time they are out of dress code. Students will keep the shirt or sweatpants.

Please encourage your students to come to school each day in dress code.

To submit early release requests, please send them to the following email address:

Here is the automatic reply when a parent requests early dismissal for the student.

"Thank you for submitting your early release request. No early dismissals 30 minutes prior to the end of the school day. For example: Half days, not after 12 pm and Regular days, not after 3 pm"

Please read the early release procedures below as some of the process has been updated.

1. We receive & approve the request.

Requests must be submitted before noon each regular school day or 10:00 am on half days.

- 2. Please let the student know there is a dismissal request.
- 3. The student should show the teacher their early release pass which will be used as a pass out of class and to the front desk.
- 4. For the safety of our students, we require that <u>any person who will be picking up a student during the school day come into the building and show their ID.</u> The person who is picking up a student will only be permitted to take the student with them if they are listed in PowerSchool.

If a student is driving themselves, <u>they will be permitted to sign out and leave at the time</u> <u>listed on their early release note.</u>
