School, Parent, and Family Engagement Policy

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Oak Hill High School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- 1. Oak Hill High School will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:

 - b. Weekly contact with parents for ongoing review of graded papers, notes, etc. sent home via student to parent to be returned to school.

The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:

- 6. Oak Hill High School will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
 - a. Elementary & Jr. High Test scores are sent home with parents at Open House or with students on the first day of school if they did not attend Open House.
 - b. High School EOC scores are sent home with students after testing is completed, parents of those students who did not pass EOC testing will be notified by our guidance counselor for summer remediation.
- 7. Oak Hill High School will take the following actions to provide each parent with timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not certified in the area in which he/she teaches by:
 - a. The Generic Right to Know Letter is posted on the school website.
 - b. Individual teacher letters are sent home with students to notify parents.
- 8. Oak Hill High School will assist parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph
 - · the state's academic content standards.
 - · the state's student academic achievement standards.
 - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
 - · the requirements of Part A,
 - · how to monitor their child's progress, and
 - · how to work with educators:

- a. The school website has teacher contact information for parents to access and links to the Rapides Parish School Board website and Louisiana Department of Education website for parents to access information about standards and assessments.
- b. PowerSchool Portal for Parents and Students is available for accessing grades for each student.
- 9. Oak Hill High School will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
 - a. Teachers send home information about how to sign up for ClassDojo and Remind to keep parents informed.
 - b. Teachers send home information on how to access students' Clever portal to access academic help at home.
- 10. Oak Hill High School will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
