#### **Transcripts**

- **Breck operates on a semester schedule with a third term called May Program.** Semester courses receive 1.0 credit unit. All students are required to take a minimum of 44 semester credits and complete May Program along with 20 hours of service beyond weekly Community Partnerships.
- Breck uses a modified block schedule. Each 75-minute class will meet five times on a 10-day rotation.
- A typical course load is 5 core academic courses each semester.
   Visual arts, performing arts, physical education and independent studies constitute 6th and/or 7th courses.
- Placement in the top rigor courses requires approval of the department. This may include, but is not limited to, previous course performance within the department, teacher recommendation and interview.
- Breck offers college prep, AP, post-AP, Honors and Advanced courses.
   The courses often move at a chapter/week pace, if not quicker.
  - AP Physics C prepares students for both the Electricity & Magnetism and Mechanics exams.
  - · Advanced courses are designed to be AP level or above.
  - Honors history courses require a 20-page paper.
- All attempted and repeated Breck courses are listed on the Breck transcript and calculated into the cumulative GPA. Any courses taken at another institution are neither included on the Breck transcript nor calculated in the Breck GPA.
- Courses that are dropped will be indicated on the transcripts with a 'W'. The grade of 'W' is not factored into the GPA.
- Waivers are indicated on the transcript. The waivers may be found in the "Notes" section in the year the waiver was received.
- May Program allows for a myriad of experiences for Breck students including seminar-style courses, travel, internships, service and research. May Program is Pass/Fail.

- Breck's Community Engagement Program. Breck's entire Upper School partners with more than 40 Twin Cities organizations every Wednesday.
- Advanced Research Programs in English, History, Math and Science.
   Breck's four premier programs facilitate high-level research opportunities, in accordance with program guidelines. Due to demanding workload, students may only take one per year.
- The Peter Clark Center for Mind, Brain, and Education bridges research
  and practice for faculty, students, and parents. Breck teachers translate
  relevant research in psychology, cognitive science, and education to
