 - d. Barrett Elementary teachers will use Rigby assessment or DRA three times during the school year to assess student progress for all struggling readers.
 - e. Our school will provide on-going professional development pertinent to student success throughout the year.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.
 - a. Parent -teacher conferences will be held with all parents of students once during the fall semester. Conferences can be face-face or virtual meetings.
 - b. Additional parent teacher conferences will be held with parents of students struggling with reading or math after each nine-week reporting period.
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their student's progress.
 - a. Barrett Elementary will provide weekly folders with individual student progress in academics and behavior.
 - b. Parents will have access to progress reports on Skyward Family Access every third and sixth week of the grading period.
 - c. Parents will have access to report cards on Skyward Family Access at the end of the nine-week grading period.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff.
 - a. Daily or weekly folders are tools teachers use to communicate with parents, as well as phone calls and emails.
 - b. Phone calls are returned within a 24-hour window.
