FULL SOLAR ECLIPSE - APRIL 8, 2024

- Visible in North America for the first time since 2017 (before that was 1979!)
- Can be seen in Williamson County between 12:18 pm to 2:58 pm with maximum totality at 1:37 pm

<u>Duration</u>: 2hr, 40m, 44s <u>Maximum</u>: 1:37 pm

<u>Duration of totality: 3m, 6s</u> <u>Full ends</u>: 1:39 pm

<u>Partial begins</u>: 12:18 pm <u>Partial ends</u>: 2:58 pm

Full begins: 1:36 pm

WILCO - CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

- Prevention and mitigation of threats to property and life, safety for responders, citizens and guests during the solar eclipse event.
- Prepare for known and unknown hazards before, during, and after the event.
- Response and resource requests shall be coordinated through the EOC, which will be activated throughout the event.

WILCO - PREPAREDNESS

 Multiple meetings with stakeholders, state and local authorities.

- Extensive discussions with experts regarding threats and hazards that are already present.
- Monitoring media for alternative threats/hazards (other pre-planned events, media's narrative).

WILCO - HAZARD ANALYSIS

- Due to a possible surge in population, Williamson
 County could see the potential for emergency situations arising in transportation, communication, public safety and other sectors.
- There could be a high influx of visitors and overwhelm our resources and infrastructure.
