NEWS FROM NURSE SARAH

When to stay home:

- Fever 100.4 or greater - must be home until fever free without use of medication for greater than 24 hours.
- Vomiting or Diarrhea - must be 24 hours symptom free and able to tolerate food and drink before returning to school.
- Any infection requiring antibiotics - keep your student home until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours.
- Persistent cough that disrupts normal activity.
- Excessive nasal drainage - check with your child's doctor before sending your child back to school.
- Unexplained rash - check with your child's doctor before sending your child to school.
- Red or draining eyes - check with your child's doctor before sending your child to school.
- COVID-19 - If you refer to the Vermont dept of health website it will walk you through the guidelines.

- Influenza - stay home until fever free without medication for 24 hours.
- Any other symptoms or illness that impedes a student's ability to learn or staff's ability to work.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Union Bank and your child's school are joining together to bring students the Save for Success school savings program. Children may have a Save for Success *Statement Savings* account and a *Certificate of Deposit* (CD*) account. Students will learn the principles of saving, how to manage money and the importance of investing money for a return, all wise money management skills your they will be able to use throughout their lives.

Statement Savings Product Overview:

- Union Bank deposits the first dollar for every student that participates **so no initial deposit is required.**
- Elementary student accounts are established as a joint account with a parent or guardian and one signature required for withdrawal.
- Students are provided with a Save for Success zipper pouch that is used to safely transport the deposit to school.
- A weekly banking day is held at the school and is run by parent volunteers. The student may make a deposit OF ANY AMOUNT to their savings account and choose a weekly prize. The volunteer will enter the deposit in the account register.
- Deposits may also be made at any UB branch or electronically.
- Statements will be mailed home on a quarterly basis.



APPEARANCE AND DRESS CODE REMINDER



CES believes that the appearance of the school and its student body are conducive to a positive educational environment. Therefore, clean and appropriate attire is required for each and every student. Students are expected to dress in a manner appropriate for children learning together.

- All shirts should be long enough to reach pants or skirts – no bare “mid-regions” will be allowed. Shirts are not to be worn off the shoulder.
- Skirts and shorts should be no shorter than the lowest point a student can reach with straight arms.
- Tank tops should have straps at least one inch wide. No spaghetti straps.
- There will be no underwear showing, including bra straps.
- Shoes are to be worn at all times. Heels should not exceed one inch.
- Clothing which has obscene or offensive language or graphics, or which advertises tobacco, alcohol, or other drugs or drug usage is not appropriate for school.




