

A STAND ALONE PROCESSES (VARYING DEADLINES)

PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SCHOLARSHIP: for graduating seniors and legal residents of PA, with a minimum 3.0 GPA, planning to attend any four year college in PA, and demonstrating leadership and community service (Two recipients/Amount varies)

PENNHOSA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for affiliated, paid HOSA chapter members by January 1 with financial need (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

FAERIE L. ANGLE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: supports young persons from Franklin County, PA studying to be lawyers. Awards will be made to students entering the first, second, and third year of a J.D. Program in PA (Number of recipients varies/ Amount varies)

EITC OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP: For students residing in a district of one of the lowest 15% achieving schools as determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Education to receive funding to attend an out-of-district or private elementary, middle, or high school within Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, and Perry counties, and the Dillsburg Area.

FILTERED THROUGH THE TFEC UNIVERSAL APPLICATION (MARCH 15 DEADLINE):

BIG 33 ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for students in PA planning to attend a technical school or accredited college or university following high school graduation. (Multiple winners/ up to \$2,000 each)

MABEL M. WITMER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating seniors from Cumberland or Franklin Counties who have plans to attend a technical or trade school to further their education. Preference is given to students who have worked or co-oped in their field (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

BEISTLE COMPANY SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for students who are legal dependents of full-time employees of the Beistle Company; second preference may be given to students graduating from Shippensburg High School; third preference may be given to students graduating from high schools within a 30 mile radius of Shippensburg (Number of recipients varies/Up to \$1,000 per year for up to four years)

GARY D. RADINE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: for dependent children of a Delta Dental employee attending a two- or four-year accredited college as a full-time student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and participating in extracurricular activities, work experience, and community service (Two recipients/\$5,000)

CHAMBERSBURG HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 1963 FUND: for graduating seniors who are descendants of 1963 graduates of Chambersburg High School, who are planning to attend a two year or four year college, trade school, or university (Number of recipients varies/Up to \$1,000)

CHAMBERSBURG HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 1988 FUND: Must be a graduating senior who is descendant or adopted child of a 1988 graduate of Chambersburg High School.

CHAMBERSBURG FANNETT-METAL SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating seniors from Chambersburg Area High School and Fannett-Metal High School, with a 2.0 GPA or higher, who plan to pursue college degrees in either computer engineering or computer science (Two recipients/Amount varies)

EASH-POTTER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: the scholarship will support students committed to improving the campus and community climate for LGBTQ+ people (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

CENTRAL PA ARCHITECTS FOUNDATION FUND: Students who are present or former residents of one of the following Pennsylvania counties: Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, or York, and currently enrolled in an architecture degree program. https://aiacentralpa.org/cpaff-scholarship-application/

JANET B. BROWNOLD & SIMON AND EVA BRENNER STUDENT TRAVEL & ENRICHMENT AWARD: This award is given to enable students of HACC to travel either in the US, or abroad for the purpose of personal or educational enrichment.

ROSS SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Established to support graduating high school seniors from Franklin County planning to attend an accredited institution of higher education. Recipients will be of a character, attitude, ability, aptitude and previous educational record as shall give promise of their being able to successfully pursue a higher educational course.

ELY-WAIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating seniors from a high school in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, or Perry Counties with plans to pursue a field of study such as Environmental Science, Environmental Studies, Environmental Engineering, Sustainable Architecture and Design, Sustainable Business, Sustainable Public Policy, Sustainable Urban Planning, or Sustainable Technology. Majors not clearly relevant to sustainability will not be considered (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

THAD G. GAYMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating seniors planning to attend a two-year or four-year college, university, or trade school as a full-time automotive technician student. Minimum GPA of 2.5 (One recipient/Amount varies)

GROVE FAMILY FUND #2 — HACC: for students attending Harrisburg Area Community College as a full-time or part time student. Minimum GPA of 2.0 or higher (Two recipients/Amount varies)

GORDON B. AND JOSEPHINE HEWLETT MEMORIAL FUND: for students from Franklin County with a 2.5 GPA or higher who wish to study nursing; priority is given to undergraduate students, but graduate students may apply (Number of recipients varies/ Amount varies)

JAMES G. HEWLETT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for students from Franklin County with a 2.5 GPA or higher studying nursing or other medical support occupations; priority is given to undergraduate students, but graduate students may apply (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

LEON I. LOCK AND BARBARA R. LOCK SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating seniors and graduates within the last five years of any high school in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, or Perry Counties who will attend HACC to study nursing (Multiple recipients/Up to \$500)

BRUCE MANGIONE FUND: for students who attend school within the city of Harrisburg and children of the employees of NRG Energy (Harrisburg office) or Harrisburg Hilton and Towers (Two recipients/Up to \$1,500)

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF CHAMBERSBURG SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating females from Chambersburg Area High School, attending any college or university (One recipient/Amount varies)

WALTERS SERVICES, INC. FABE & BEVERLY WALTERS SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Applicants must be children of employees under the age of 26, or must be a seasonal employee under the age of 26, with plans to attend college, university, or a trade school as a full -time or part-time student. (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

ROYER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND: The Royer family have established this fund to help their employees, their children or grandchildren gain additional education to help them succeed in life. This scholarship is available for trade, 2 or 4-year post high school continued education for full or part-time students. (Up to 4 awards/ \$1000-\$2500)

DR. GEORGEH. AND MRS. HETTIE S. LOVE "LOVE OF LEARNING " SCHOLARSHP FUND: Established by the Bishop Nathan Baxter Chapter of the Union of Black Episcopalians for Students of Color with a primary focus on the Black community, entering a 2-year or 4-year college majoring in Education.

DRANE AND STEELE MUSIC SCHOLRSHIP: for students from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, and York Counties, studying classical music composition, teaching, and performance (Multiple recipients/Up to \$5,000)

KENNETH G. ROBINSON, APR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: for PA undergraduate students who are civic-minded and require tuition assistance to continue their education in the Communication and Public Relations fields. (\$1000)

NICK PANTALONE MEMORIAL SCHOLARHSHIP: For students graduating from high schools located in the following counties: Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, Perry and Northern York County (Dillsburg Area). Students must have at least a 3.0 GPA. 1 award up to \$2500

MATCHING AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

AES/PHEAA's PATH Program: Scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by AES/ PHEAA's PATH ("Partnerships for Access to Higher Education") Program. PHEAA may grant matching funds to scholarship recipients who are enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school as an undergraduate student on at least a half-time basis, who are a Pennsylvania state grant recipient and who demonstrate financial need. Students must also be a resident of Pennsylvania, not in default on any educational loans, maintain academic progress, and not be considered an incarcerated student. The match provides last-dollar support for tuition and fees. Scholarship funds used for reimbursement of textbook purchases are not eligible for a PATH Program match. The scholarship recipient's information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff. No additional work will be asked of the scholarship recipient.
