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Green Bay Area Public School District's State Report Card Score Improves from 58.2 to 60.1

Green Bay, WI -November 19, 2024- The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) has released the state report cards for school districts and their schools. For this year, there are several important items to note:

- To align with recent updates in Wisconsin Academic Standards in ELA and mathematics, DPI updated assessments in 2023-24, which included performance level cut scores.
- The updated cut scores better reflect the performance of Wisconsin students on assessments.
- Due to these assessment updates, scoring for student achievement on the 2023-24 school and district report cards was modified to allow for system stability and for schools and districts to compare this year's report cards to report cards from 2022-23.

“Given the significant changes in how the 2023-24 state report cards have been calculated, the Green Bay Area Public School District views these report cards as a new baseline from which to continue to improve,” stated Associate Superintendent David Johns. “While the state report cards are one measure of student achievement, they do validate our own internal measures that our students are demonstrating accelerated growth, and we anticipate this trend to continue with the adoption of our new literacy and math curriculum.”

The Green Bay Area Public School District's overall score on the 2023-24 state report card is 60.1 - Meets Expectations. In 2022-23, the District's overall score was 58.2 - Meets Expectations.

Highlights from the state report cards include:

- The Green Bay Area Public School District continues to exceed the state average (22.9% vs. 21.1%) in number of students successfully completing at least one Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate course.
- The Green Bay Area Public School District continues to exceed the state average (30.5% vs. 25.7%) in the number of students successfully completing at least one dual enrollment course.
- The Green Bay Area Public School District continues to exceed the state average (5.0% vs. 4.7%) in the number of students who earned at least one industry-recognized credential.
- Four schools (Aldo Leopold, Chappell, Lincoln and Tank) moved from Meets Expectations to Exceeds Expectations.
- The District had two fewer schools in the Fails to Meet Expectations category (7 schools in 2022-23 vs. 5 in 2023-24).

Founded in 1856 with the opening of the Sale School, the Green Bay Area Public School District is more than 150 years old. A unified school district of 92 square miles, it covers the city of Green Bay, all of the village of Allouez, the village of Bellevue, the town of Scott, as well as part of the towns of Ledgeview, Eaton, Green Bay and Humboldt.
