Crockett County Middle School's basketball teams continued their respective winning streaks by sweeping a doubleheader at Gibson County Monday night, with the girls posting a 44-11 victory and the Cavaliers downing the Pioneers 40-20.

For Coach Jamar Turner's Lady Cavs, their sixth consecutive win boosted their record to 8-3 for the season. For Coach Tyler Gadlen's boys, the win streak is at three and the overall record stands at 7-4. The girls contest was a laugher from the beginning. Crockett drilled in four three-pointers in the first quarter alone – two by Lola Bailey – and those four baskets would have been enough to win the game. CCMS sprinted to a 20-4 edge after the first period and extended the halftime margin to 33-8.

Leading the offensive rampage in limited minutes was Jentry Maddox with 17 points. Khylee Cobb added 10, Bailey and Haley Leforgee contributed six apiece, and Emilee Chandler netted three. Marlei Overstreet paced Gibson County with seven.

After a sluggish first half - the contest was tied 12-12 at the intermission - Crockett's boys came roaring out of the dressing room to dominate the third period 16-4 as Brody Haley scored eight of his game-high 12 points.

The Cavs won the fourth quarter 12-4 to end up doubling the score on the Pioneers overall.

Backing Haley for Crockett were Will Dodds with nine, Davis Porter with seven, and Jeremiah Young with four. Gadlen's club achieved the triumph despite making only two of its 15 free throws in the contest.

"Trust me, we're about to shoot a ton tomorrow (in practice)," Gadlen laughed after the game.

Brayden DuRall led Gibson County with a nine-point performance. Both Crockett teams return home Thursday night for a 6:00 twin bill with Trenton.

The official high school schedule begins tonight (Tuesday) as the CCHS squads travel to Jackson North Side for a 6:00 doubleheader.


