QUICK FACTS

- All-male, college-preparatory Catholic private school founded in 1871 in the tradition of the De La Salle Christian Brothers, serving 735 students in grades 9 through 12, with 172 students in the senior class.
- Lasallian Core Principles: Faith in the Presence of God, Quality Education, Concern for the Poor and Social Justice, Respect for All Persons, and Inclusive Community
- Network of 15,000+ alumni across the country and abroad
- 11:1 student-faculty ratio; Average class size of 18
- For the 2024-2025 school year, approximately 46% of CBHS families received financial aid totaling \$2.5 million.
- Average ACT Score for Top 10% of the Class of 2024: 32; Average ACT Score for Class of 2024: 24
- The 169 members of the Class of 2024 were accepted to 161 unique colleges and universities across 37 states. They attended 51 institutions and earned a combined \$17.4 million in merit-based scholarships.
- In the past 6 years, 11 students were named National Merit finalists with 20 students commended for their performance on the PSAT.
- Fourteen students have scored perfect ACT scores in the past 7 years.

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Since 2012, CBHS has implemented a 1:1 technology model, ensuring every student has a laptop for his entire academic career. In 2020, CBHS implemented a hybrid-learning model following the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. Since Spring 2021, CBHS students resumed attending class in-person full-time.

GRADING & RANKING

- Christian Brothers does not rank students.
- Transcripts only include courses and grades completed at Christian Brothers High School. If a student enters CBHS with high school credits, a transcript from his previous school will be provided.
- GPA is calculated solely using courses completed at Christian Brothers High School.
- Honors and dual-enrollment courses are weighted one quality point. AP courses and Advanced Calculus III are weighted two quality points.

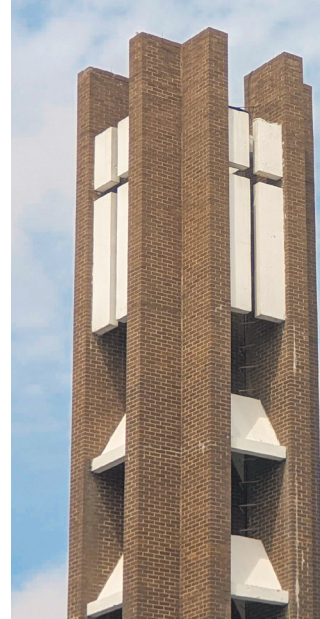
