Over the next few weeks, I will highlight some of the instructional approaches we use at Wyoming Primary Schools to provide all students with the building blocks needed for the future. This week, I will share information about a key component of our reading instructional practices, Orton-Gillingham.

This helps students make meaningful connections with language, enhancing their decoding, spelling, and writing abilities. Our skilled teachers, who receive specialized training in OG instruction, are able to tailor lessons to each child's needs, providing essential support and early intervention to foster reading success for every student.

## **Key Reasons for Providing Orton-Gillingham Instruction:**
