



BY THE NUMBERS






Gifts to the MSSM Foundation come from multiple sources with one thing in common, a deep commitment and care for MSSM.

In FY24 the majority of funds donated came from parents of students and alumni. The alumni body of MSSM is an expanding population, with the oldest alumni just entering the middle of their careers. They continue to give to the Foundation in greater quantity.

Friends and other MSSM family members (grandparents, for example), corporations and foundations, and even MSSM staff, make up the remaining donors.

In-Kind Gifts (\$24,000) provided much appreciated furniture and equipment.



Where Gifts Go

Donors can direct their gifts toward a project, or leave their gift unrestricted. Most donors to the MSSM Foundation choose to give their gifts unrestricted, allowing the Foundation and school administration to identify the area of greatest need. Unrestricted gifts counted for just under half of the total dollars donated.

The largest single designation was towards facilities which included the installation of the fume hood and laboratory benches. Other large designations include the solar project, financial aid and scholarships for the MSSM Summer Camp. Donors also gave to the Howard Family Lectures Series and other endowed funds and for several other specific purposes.

The MSSM Foundation raises funds for both unrestricted and restricted purposes. Some donations to the Foundation are used to create or supplement endowed funds, which are held in endowment with the Maine Community Foundation. Other donations are given for specific purposes such as scholarships or capital projects. Unrestricted gifts are used to help fund operations and grant requests reviewed by the MSSM Foundation Grant Committee. The Foundation also facilitates in-kind gifts of equipment, supplies, and other goods and services. The last three years have seen tremendous growth in the amount of funds transferred to MSSM in the form of grants.



In '23-'24, the Michael P. Fabio Exploration Fund awarded five student grants, totaling \$11,605, continuing Michael's legacy at MSSM.




TRIBUTE TO ART THOMPSON
