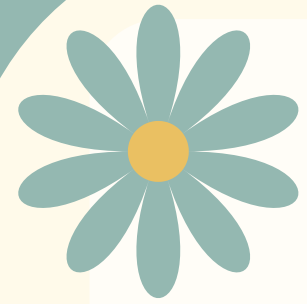
What is Dual Enrollment?

The Dual Enrollment program is an opportunity for qualified high school students to earn college credits. The student is "dually" enrolled in high school and in college. The student can be a full time or part time college student.

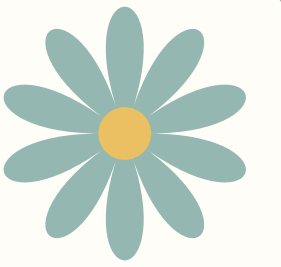
The student earns college credits as well as high school credits needed for graduation including electives.

What are the Benefits?

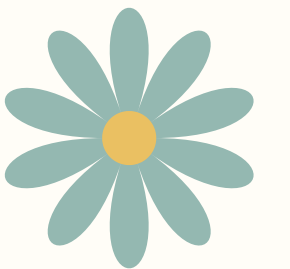
- 01** Free head start on college – Dual Enrollment covers tuition, books & mandatory fees
- 02** Provides flexibility with school scheduling
- 03** Helps some students with the transition to college from high school
- 04** Does not cut into credit hours for the HOPE Scholarship
- 05** Access to a variety of advanced curriculum
- 06** Opportunity to investigate and pursue career goals




Things Current Students Like Most About Dual Enrollment...



- The independence & freedom
- Freedom to pick my schedule / Flexibility of classes
- Getting ahead with college credits
- The college experience
- Sleeping in
- Study the material in my own learning style and work at my own pace; ability to work ahead
- Don't have to go everyday



Some Challenging Issues ...

- Communication with professors; not always easy to reach
- Grade determined only by 3 tests or low amount of tests
- Time management, learning on my own, keeping up with the workload
- Breaks are not the same – went to school when friends were off for fall break; schedule doesn't line up
- Since it is at my own pace, I procrastinate too much
- Navigating different online platforms, course expectations, etc.
- Some professors aren't as understanding as teachers at Mill Creek
- Classes move quickly; I have to study more
- Professors don't tell you exactly what to study for a test – must self study a bunch
- Having to take classes at night 

Dual Enrollment Information

- 11th & 12th graders have a larger selection of colleges
- 10th graders can attend technical schools but can only take technical electives. To take core credits at a non-technical college, student must meet higher admission requirements. Most colleges do not accept 10th graders.
- Students can only earn 30 hours through dual enrollment throughout all of high school. Families can pay for courses if student exceeds 30 hours.
- Students can't retake failed/dropped courses.
- If student drops 2 classes, student become ineligible to participate in the dual enrollment program.

A Few Dual Enrollment Details

- No residency or citizenship requirement
- Must meet postsecondary institution's admission requirements
- Cannot have already met graduation requirements at the beginning of the school year
- Eligible for summer study
- Student must maintain "Satisfactory Academic Progress" at the college – can be withdrawn from college if not meeting academic progress.



PHASES OF THE PROGRAM

Part Time

Full Time

- Combination of classes at Mill Creek and the college of your choice
- Six classes are taken between college and Mill Creek (ex. 2 at college & 4 at MC) both semesters
- Plan college classes and class times around the courses student selected to take at Mill Creek



- Attend class at the college full-time
- No classes at MCHS – minimum of 4 classes at the college both semesters
- Still considered a Mill Creek student
- Up to 15 semester hours
- Must earn 2.5 credits per semester in order to be eligible for participation in athletics at Mill Creek

A Few Things To Consider ...

- Colleges communicate with the student – not the parent/guardian or with Mill Creek.
- Students must be able to handle all college responsibilities on their own.
- While participating in dual enrollment courses, students will be expected to follow the course syllabus – this includes navigating through different online platforms for their college classes, the course requirements and expectations will vary from course to course.
- Some course specific fees must be covered by the student.

A Few More Things To Consider ...

- Final grades are sent at the end of the semester ... MC & parents may not know about a failing grade until the end.
- Mill Creek's & the college's calendars don't always align. Professors may not excuse absences due to family spring break plans, high school activities, etc.
- Competitive colleges may not consider dual enrollment courses as rigorous as Advanced Placement courses.
- Credit transferability is not guaranteed.
- Mill Creek announcements/information will be missed.
- Student may be in classes with adults & be the youngest in the room.

Even More Things To Consider ...

- Parking is NOT guaranteed for Dual Enrollment students. Must have a back-up plan if you don't get a parking pass.
- Students are not allowed to be on Mill Creek's campus on days or periods they don't have their college classes.
 1. Students can't hang out in the media center, another classroom, or the commons.
 2. This includes students taking dual enrollment courses online.
 3. If you are unable to leave campus during your assigned dual enrollment courses, you will need to reconsider participating in the program.
- Students must factor in travel time, parking, traffic, bell schedules, etc. Students will be expected to comply with MC's bell schedule and with their college class times. The two don't always work together & students can't be tardy to either one.
- Students will plan their college classes around their Mill Creek classes. MC classes will not change 2nd semester.

And Last But Not Least To Consider ...

- Per the dual enrollment guidelines of GA & GCPS, students are not supposed to drop classes after the start of the semester – even if it is hard, making a D, will fail the class, etc. A letter grade of Z will be placed on the transcript if a student does drop a class.
- Dropping courses or failing courses would result in student being removed from the dual enrollment program.
- Colleges will dismiss students from the program due to unsatisfactory academic performance. (ex. at UNG semester GPA drops below a 2.5 ... made all Ds, C & D, etc.)
- Student services (504 Plans, IEP, etc.) must be arranged with the college by the student.
 1. Please speak to your case manager prior to enrolling in dual enrollment courses.
 2. Accommodations given at the college could be different than ones given at Mill Creek.

Accelerated Career Diploma

- A different route to a diploma ... Great option for students who want to enter the workforce as soon as possible. (Ex. Welding, Early Childhood Care & Education, Automotive, etc.) 
- Accelerated Career students do not complete the required traditional 23 credits ... students take certain HS courses and then must complete 2 approved certificates, programs that lead to licensure, a diploma, or an Associate of Applied Science. 
- Not a program for students planning to transition to a 4 year college.

- 2 English - including EOC course
- 2 Math - including EOC course
- 2 Science - including EOC course
- 2 Social Studies
- 1 Health/Personal Fitness

Technical College Requirements:

- 2 Technical Certificates OR

- A Program Leading to Licensure OR
- Associates of Applied Science Degree



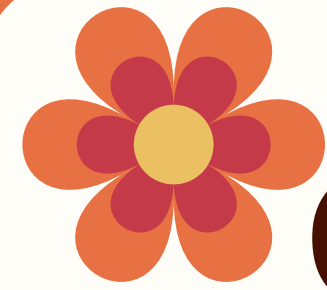
- Attend the Dual Enrollment (DE) Informational Meeting
 - Complete the 2024-2025 Dual Enrollment Information Form – link at the end of presentation
 - Complete and return the Mill Creek 2024-2025 Dual Enrollment Contract to Mrs. Griffin
 - Take the SAT/ACT/ACCUPLACER before MC's &/or the college's admission deadline and have scores sent to colleges. Send AP scores to exempt intro level courses.
 - Complete your college application before March 13, 2024
 - You are responsible for following the college's application procedures and meeting all deadlines.

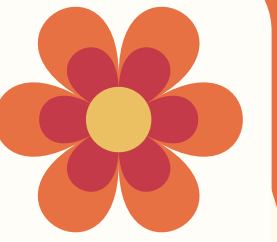


All paperwork due & apply to the college (even if college deadline is later – must meet MC's deadline):

Dual Enrollment Policies and Procedures

CHECKLIST FOR PARTICIPATION



- Submit the DE Funding Application on www.GAfutures.org -- this is done once a year. Both student & parent must complete their individual portions. Application is supposed to open February 1st.
- After receiving your college acceptance, set up an advisement appointment with Mrs. Griffin to plan your Mill Creek & college classes.
- Part-time Dual Enrollment students will need to plan all college classes around their Mill Creek schedule. Mill Creek schedule (courses selected and periods to remain on campus) must be finalized by May 8, 2025.
- Part-time DE students will need to make transportation arrangements. Remember parking passes are not guaranteed.

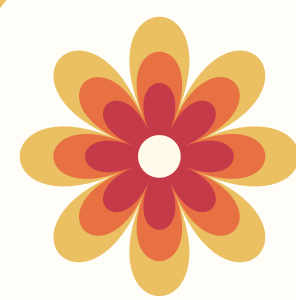

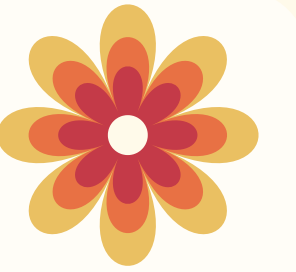
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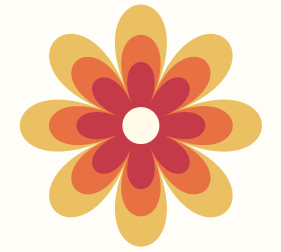

Dual Enrollment Policies and Procedures CHECKLIST FOR PARTICIPATION



- Register for college classes – follow college procedures for registration.
- Turn in a copy of your schedule to Mrs. Griffin – must do this every semester.
- Dual enrollment students are responsible for completing all high school graduation requirements in order to participate in the graduation ceremony. If you select a college to attend that does not finish before GCPS, your participation in the graduation ceremony will be effected.

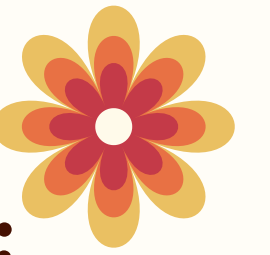

How Does Grading Work?



- All Classes will earn 1.00 credit on the high school transcript; basically counting twice in the high school GPA on the transcript & for the HOPE Scholarship.
- Science labs do not earn high school credit.
- Letter grades from the college will be transcribed as:
A = 95 B = 85 C = 75 D = 72* F = 55
- Additional points are NOT added to the college grade on the high school transcript.
- Students receive a .5 GPA boost for DE courses on their HOPE transcript.
- All Dual Enrollment courses will be included on the high school transcript – including Fs.
- Failing a course or not taking a course required for graduation would result in the student not graduating.



Dropping or Changing Courses

- Dropping classes is NOT an option – even if failing, struggling, etc.
- Any course changes must be sent to Mrs. Griffin.
- When colleges/professors advertise Drop/Add timeframes during the semester ... These are for current college students, not dual enrollment students. Remember – no dropping after the beginning of semester.
- Student's graduation status could be impacted if courses are dropped or changed without approval.

Course Sequencing

- Math: Course placement determined by SAT/ACT Scores. No Algebra II equivalent – must have high school credit.
- Science: College Pre-Calculus credit is a prerequisite before Physics can be taken at the college.
- Intro to Biology courses can not count as 4th science for graduation. If needed, best to get 4th science credit at MC.
- English: If 11th LA is not taken at MC, at college must take English 1101, English 1102, & then American Lit for graduation.
- History: U.S. History 2111 or US History 2112 meets graduation requirements
- Economics taken at the college level has to be specific courses to meet graduation requirements. Beginning Summer 2025, ECON 1101 for now is the only course meeting graduation requirements.

Transferring DE Credits

It is the student's responsibility to verify with colleges regarding their policies on accepting transfer credit and how the credit will be used (elective vs credits for major). The counselor is responsible for advising on courses needed for graduation.

Students who are looking to attend private or out-of-state colleges & universities need to speak to those colleges to determine what is accepted.



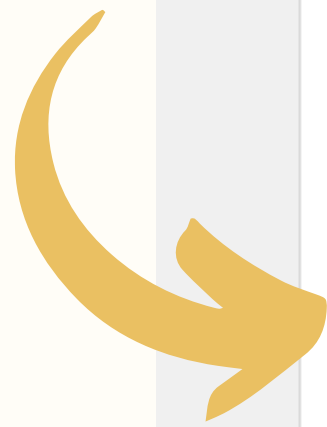



Sending Your Transcript

Mill Creek must have your social security number on file to send transcripts through the GAfutures website.

- 
1. Log into your www.GAFutures.org account.
 2. Click on the "COLLEGE PLANNING" tab at the top.
 3. Scroll through the list and select "HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS".
 4. Click the college(s) to which you want your transcript sent.
 5. Enter your SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER and DATE OF BIRTH if not displayed. Remember to return to your PROFILE and add your Social Security Number & Date of Birth if it was not displayed.
 6. Select **MILL CREEK** in the section requesting your high school where your final transcript will be located.
 7. Select your graduation year in the next section.
 8. Click the **ACKNOWLEDGE** square.
 9. Select  button to see the transcript the college will receive.
 10. Select  to send your transcript.

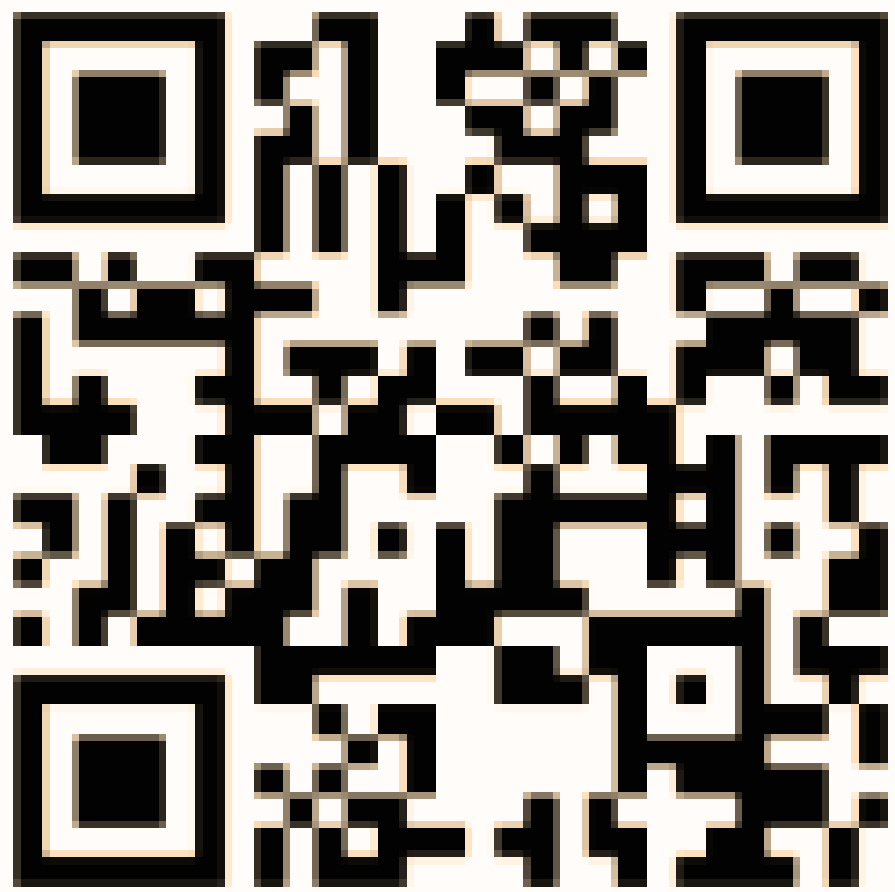
