In October, the HHS Counseling Office welcomed Ms. Claudia Wenzel from John Carroll University to speak with families about the Financial Aid process. Ms. Wenzel provided information on the timeline and key updates from the new FAFSA process. Below are some highlights:

- Now is the time for seniors **and** parents to request an FSA ID through the <u>Federal Student Aid website</u>.
- The FAFSA for the next academic year is slated to open on December 1.
- Students must be admitted to a college/university in order for that school to create a Financial Aid Award package.
- FIVE major updates were highlighted from the new FAFSA.

Personal & Professional Development Workshops


Our office puts on a workshop series highlighting key personal & professional growth opportunities. There is one workshop each month, hosted during Explorer Period.

FRESHMEN & SOPHOMORE CLASSROOM LESSONS

In November, the school counselors highlighted the top 10 executive functioning skills in the freshmen English classes. Students then completed a Skills Assessment in Schoolinks to identify their individual areas of strengths. Schoolinks connects their skills to careers that strongly align with their strengths! Freshmen have been asked to schedule an individual meeting with their school counselor before winter break!





In December, the HHS Counseling team will be working with all sophomores to dive deeper into career exploration. Students will begin by completing the Myers-Briggs Personality assessment. Counselors will work with students to connect their personality assessment results to career clusters, Six District Compact opportunities and post-secondary opportunities.
