Bad Weather, School Delays or Closures



School closures, delays, or changes in bus routes, snow routes, may result from emergencies such as inclement weather conditions. School decisions are typically made by 6:00 a.m. after transportation personnel have examined the local conditions determining if we can safely bring everyone to school or we need to either delay the start of school or cancel school for the day.

When weather related emergencies occur, announcements are usually broadcast by the local television media (KEZI, KVAL, KMTR, KLSR) and announced on radio stations (such as KUGN, KPNW, AND KEED/KSND). The media obtains and broadcasts their information from Flash News, www.flashnews.net. You will also be getting messages via the district's messaging system Blackboard in the form of a Robocall, text message, and email message. In addition, we will be putting out an announcement via Seesaw to our elementary families.

Pertussis Recommendations and Prevention 2024

What is Whooping Cough (Pertussis)?

Whooping cough is a respiratory illness caused by a type of bacteria called Bordetella pertussis. The disease is only found in humans.



- The bacteria that cause whooping cough spread easily from person to person through the air. When
 a person with whooping cough sneezes or coughs, they release small particles with the bacteria in
 them. Other people can then breathe in the bacteria.
- Treating whooping cough early with antibiotics may make the infection less serious.

Pertussis Vaccines:

 The best way to prevent whooping cough is to get vaccinated. <u>CDC recommends whooping cough</u> vaccination for everyone.



 Whooping cough vaccines work but aren't perfect. For people who've been vaccinated but still get whooping cough, their illness is generally milder.

Pertussis Symptoms:

It usually takes 5 to 10 days for symptoms to appear after exposure to the bacteria that cause whooping cough. Sometimes symptoms don't develop for as long as 3 weeks. Whooping cough appears similar to a common cold early on.

Early symptoms: Can last for 1 to 2 weeks and usually include:

- Runny or stuffed-up nose
- Low-grade fever (less than 100.4°F)
- Mild, occasional cough
- Wheezing

These symptoms usually appear in stages and not all at once. Later symptoms: One to 2 weeks after the first symptoms start, people may develop paroxysms, known as coughing fits for up to 6 weeks.



- Make a high-pitched "whoop" when they inhale after a coughing fit
- Vomit during or after coughing fits
- · Feel very tired after the fit
- · Struggle to breathe
- · Fracture (break) a rib

Are some people at higher risk from whooping cough?

People at greatest risk from whooping cough include:

- Infants under one year old.
- Pregnant people (especially in the third trimester).
- People that have a chronic respiratory illness.
- Whooping cough can cause serious and sometimes deadly complications in babies and young children.

What to do when you are sick:

Most people with whooping cough can manage their symptoms at home.

- Take antibiotics exactly as prescribed by your healthcare provider.
- Keep your home free from things that cause coughing like: Smoke, Dust, Chemical fumes.
- Get plenty of fluids, including water, juices, and fruits.
- Don't take cough medicine unless your healthcare provider recommends it. Giving cough medicine probably won't help and isn't usually recommended for children younger than 4 years old.



Inclement Weather Bus Routes

When road conditions are such that the district transportation system will be restricted the following changes in bus routes will take place. If there are no announcements transportation will operate as usual.

Hills Creek Road – Route 3

The bus will turn around at the Jasper Christian Church at Hills Creek and Kenney Road. Students living beyond this stop will be able to catch the bus there.

Wallace Creek Road - Route 4

The bus will turn around at Weyerhaeuser Road, just beyond 37047 Wallace Creek Road; students living above this road will be able to catch the bus there.

North Morningstar - Route 5

This road will be BYPASSED. The bus will pick up students at the intersection of North Morningstar Road and Enterprise Road.

Papenfuss Road - Route 5

If the weather is such that the bus can't go up Papenfuss Road, all students will need to meet the bus at the intersection of Papenfuss and Enterprise. This change will be announced.

Lost Creek Road - Route 7

The bus will turn around at Kimball Road & South Rattlesnake. Bus 7 will then proceed to Lost Creek Road and stop at Rattlesnake and the Quarry Road. Students living on the South side of Rattlesnake Hill, Hanna Road, Harold Road, and Lost Valley will be able to catch the bus there.

Intersection of Rattlesnake and Lost Valley Road - Route 7

Students ON Lost Valley Will also catch the bus at the Quarry road.

Lost Creek Road - Route 1

Lost Creek bus will wait at the intersection of Lost Valley & Lost Creek.
