PSEO

Who can enroll? Grades 10-12.

Grade 10 is Career and Technical Courses. Courses in Grade 10 **do not** substitute for CHS classes. They are elective classes.

Grades 11-12 take classes to fulfill CHS grad requirements and general degree requirements for college.

What colleges offer PSEO? Minnesota Department of Education has a list of eligible institutions. Website Link: https://education.mn.gov/MDE/dse/ccs/pseo/elig/040787

How do students earn credits?

4 college credits = 1 CHS credit For example a 4 credit English Composition class at Century College is equal to 1 CHS credit or World Literature 1 and 2.

How do you pay tuition and fees?

Tuition and books are paid by the state. If you don't return the books, you will be charged a fee.

PSEO Risks and Possible Consequences

What if I drop a PSEO class?

If a student drops a class after the first 10 days of the semester, you will receive a NC (F) on your CHS transcript.

How does enrolling in PSEO affect your ability to complete high school requirements?

Students still need to take courses at the college to substitute for CHS classes. Sometimes, classes are not offered at the college or are at capacity. Example, If a student needs a 4-credit composition class to graduate and the college only offers a 3 credit Composition class.

Academic and social responsibilities that must be assumed by the student and their parent/guardians.

Centennial high school counselors can not communicate with college. This includes attendance, grades, services etc. This is the liability of the student.

Will my PSEO credits transfer to a college?

It is the student and family's responsibility to reach out to the college they plan to attend to see if the credit will transfer. Other resources students may use is Transferology and MN transfer curriculum.

Chromebooks- CHS Chromebooks are not supported by several colleges. It's best practice to check with the college. You may need to purchase own laptop or work with the college to use their computer lab.
