RH: How does it feel to be graduating?


MK: Excited, a relief, but definitely surreal.

In 1998, Dr. Rigby received her PhD in systematic theology from Princeton Theological Seminary. An ordained minister in the PC(USA), Professor Rigby served on the board of the Presbyterian Publishing Corporation from 2014 to 2022 and served as an author of the Sarasota Statement for NEXT Church 2017. In 2010, Dr. Rigby became the first faculty member elected to Austin Seminary's Board of Trustees.








Gratitude & The Light
