EXCUSED ABSENCES

- Medical notes from a Physician must be turned in to the Attendance Office within **3 days** of the student's absence. If medical excuses are not submitted in a timely manner, students could receive a FA and will not receive credit for the course (FA = Failure due to attendance).
- Bereavement for one's immediate family. An obituary or Funeral Program must be turned in to the Attendance Office within **3 days** of the student's return to school.
- Judicial excuses must be turned in within **3 days** of the student's absence for the legal process.

EARLY DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

- Students may be picked up in the Front Office by the Parent/Guardian or by a designated Emergency Contact in PowerSchool. The person picking up the student(s) must present a picture ID at the time of the pick up.
- **EARLY DISMISSAL FOR STUDENT DRIVERS**
- All early dismissals must be verified by phone. Early dismissal requests must be sent to: **AHSAttendance@horrycountyschools.net** and should be done **at least 30 minutes in advance on the day of the dismissal.**
- After phone verification, a pass will be created and placed with the sign-out sheet in the front office. Students signing themselves out can come at break, lunch, or their sign out time to pick up their passes. When their dismissal time arrives, students go to the front office to sign out.
- Due to the volume of sign outs daily, student drivers **will not** be called out of class for pre-arranged dismissal to avoid interrupting instruction.

MAKE-UP TIME/CREDIT RECOVERY

- **Credit Recovery with Teachers**: Make-Up time with teachers before and after school may be applied towards attendance recovery. Attendance Recovery sheets can be picked up in the table outside the Attendance Office. These must be filled out and signed by the teacher hosting the recovery session, then turned in to the Attendance Office in a timely manner.
- **Saturday School**: AHS will offer multiple Saturday Schools each year from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm for students whose absences exceed the number allowed by the State of South Carolina. Attendees are required to bring work to do during that time. Transportation IS NOT provided for Saturday School.
- **Wednesday School**: AHS offers attendance recovery on select Wednesdays from 3:30–5:00. These will be announced at a later date. Bus transportation is provided if needed.

TRUANCY

A student under the age of 17 is TRUANT when they have 3 (three) consecutive unexcused absences, or a total of 5 (five) unexcused absences IN A SCHOOL YEAR. If truancy occurs, parents will be contacted to arrange a conference with the Administrator to develop an **AIP** (Attendance Intervention Plan) which is in effect for one calendar year.

DURING THIS CALENDAR YEAR, AHS MAY NOT BE ABLE TO SIGN DRIVERS LICENSE FORMS ALLOWING STUDENTS TO OBTAIN THEIR LICENSE.
