This week, Bennett Elementary School fourth graders have been learning about the history of hip-hop and building hip-hop skills such as rapping, DJing, breakdancing, and art during the week-long "History of Hip-Hop" program hosted by Hip-Hop & Hope. And this Friday, the students are showcasing everything they have learned at an assembly in the school gym.

Michael Bloom of Hip-Hop & Hope, a former Fargo Police Department School Resource Officer who served Fargo Public Schools, has spent 40 minutes a day each day this week in all Bennett fourth grade classrooms, teaching students about hip-hop and hip-hop skills. He showed the students how the artform can bring people together, build community, and help people make a positive impact on those around them.

The program teaches students that their voices matter and that they can express their feelings through the core elements of hip-hop. Regardless of their family's income, race, or background, students are encouraged to use their unique talents in DJing, MCing, dance, and art to share their perspectives and make a positive impact.

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
