I hope that everyone is enjoying a relaxing summer filled with memorable activities. This is always an exciting time of the year as our staff prepares to welcome students and parents for the commencement of school. On behalf of the South Ocean staff, I would like to welcome you to the 2024-2025 school year.

The district has posted the informational packet and required forms to you via ParentSquare this year. Please review the forms closely as they require digital acknowledgement. Student schedules will be posted to the eSchool parent and student portals on Monday, August 26, 2024. Students will report to their first period classes on Thursday, September 5, 2024, for the first day of school. At that time, they will be provided with a printed copy of their schedule. If you have not already signed up for the eSchool Parent Portal or ParentSquare, you can find information on our website at the following link https://www.pmschools.org/Page/9658 or utilize this QR code for convenience.



As our district has moved to being paperless, these applications will be important resources for you to access and utilize throughout the school year. I hope that we can work together to help our children successfully meet their personal goals and the goals that our teachers set for them this school year. It is important to me that we have a strong connection between home and school. I will regularly send out ParentSquare messages with updated information regarding happenings at school. Additionally, teachers are accessible by ParentSquare and will share important class information with you via that platform. If you have not signed up for ParentSquare or the eSchool Parent Portal, please do so. If you already have a portal account, please ensure that parental contact information as well as emergency contact information is up to date.

#### Bell Schedule

Please note that student arrival at school is 7:55 AM. First period starts at 8:03 AM. We will have morning extra help on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday, from 7:35 AM to 8:00 AM. Students should only arrive early at school when attending extra help. Therefore, students should not arrive at school before 7:50 AM, as there will be no morning supervision of students prior to that time. When the school day ends at 2:42 PM, all students should exit the building unless they are staying after for a club or sports. All clubs and sports will begin at 2:50 PM. There will be a 4:00 PM late bus for students who attend clubs from 2:50 PM to 3:50 PM.

#### Security/Entry to School/ID Cards

All visitors to the school will be required to show government-issued identification, which will be utilized to print a visitor badge and keep records of all visitors within the school. Please ensure your child's emergency contacts are updated by reviewing your eSchool Parent Portal account. All students will be issued an ID card during the first two weeks of school. Students must have their ID cards with them and wear them on the provided lanyard every day to enter and navigate the building and to access the restrooms. If a student does not have their ID card, they will be asked to wait in line to type in their ID number upon arrival to school; this will be after all students with ID cards enter the building. For lost cards, there will be a charge of \$4.00 to replace the card.

#### Supplies/Locker Usage

Our school supply list has been revised for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students to include a two-binder system with one locker stop during 4<sup>th</sup> period lunch. This will help to keep students organized and on time for classes. In 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade we include three binders for the school day breaking the 9-period day into a three-binder system with one binder for 3 class periods. Students in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade will only be permitted to use their lockers before period 1, and after periods 3, 6, and 9. Students are not permitted to carry a backpack from class to class.

Our welcome back to school booklet that includes many more school specific updates and vital information will be shared with you via ParentSquare. Please take a moment to access it and read through it as it contains various updates and changes to procedures. Additionally, our school supply lists are enclosed in the welcome back booklet and are also located on our website https:// www.pmschools.org/Domain/441.

As we begin another school year, I offer the following reflection and goal setting questions that you may want to utilize with your children to reflect on the past and look towards the future:

- 1. What were my best achievements this past school year? How did those achievements make me feel?

#### Security

Please note that all visitors during the school day must enter through the front doors and be buzzed into our school. In order to maintain a safe environment for our students, visitors are required to show Government issued photo identification in order to receive a visitor pass to their destination. Visitors without photo identification will not be allowed to enter the building. All visitors must return their pass before leaving the building.

#### **Testing Accommodations for Declassified Students**

If your child has been declassified by the Committee on Special Education and has been approved for testing accommodations, please notify Mrs. Erdmann if you would like your child to access the testing accommodations noted on his/her last IEP. Please be prepared to submit a copy of your child's last IEP to substantiate your child's need for testing accommodations.

#### **Sporting Events**

Students are welcome to be spectators at our sporting events. These events begin at 4:00 p.m. and usually end between 5:00 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. Once school is dismissed, all students must go home and return at 4:00 p.m. for the sporting event. Students will not be permitted in the school or on school grounds before the game begins. Transportation at the end of the event must be arranged with a parent.

#### Clubs

Our after-school programs are hosted by our South Ocean teachers to work with your students and support their learning and achievement. These programs begin in late September and meet on different days Monday through Thursday after school.

#### **Positive Choices**

Positive Choices is our program where we educate the students and encourage them to make better choices and not repeat behavior that warrants consequences. Positive Choices meets every Thursday after school and is assigned by the administration. Our goal is to reduce, remove and improve student behavior and decision making.

#### **Transportation**

As per district policy, students may only take their assigned bus. If a parent has made regular babysitting arrangements to be in a home within the South Ocean area, a new bus pass may be issued. If parents share joint custody of their child and both parents live in the South Ocean area, two bus passes may be issued. A letter must be forwarded to the Transportation Office for approval. **Students may not go home on a friend's bus at any time**. Emergencies must be approved by the Transportation Supervisor only.

#### **Electronic Devices**

Students are not to use <u>anv</u> electronic device (cell phones, Ipods, etc.) while in school. We realize that most students have cell phones for emergency situations, however, we ask that the cell phone be secured during the school day. If your child is not feeling well, they should report to the nurse. If necessary, the nurse will contact you or your designated contact person. There is a telephone in the main office for student use during lunch periods and before and after school. Teachers have been instructed to confiscate a cell phone that is being used in class or in the cafeteria. Cell phones will not be returned to students. It will be the responsibility of the parent to come to the Main Office to collect the cell phone and sign for it.

#### **Legal Papers**

If you have any legal papers regarding any issue that you feel the school should be aware of, please be sure to submit a copy for our records.

#### **Important Health Notice**

All students and staff must adhere to the district's wellness policy. The safety and health of all of our students is our priority. No food is permitted in class. With the number of potential food and allergy reactions, we must be vigilant, proactive and alert for everyone.

#### Lost and Found

We maintain a "Lost and Found" and encourage both parents and students to check for any missing items. Our "Lost and Found" is located in the school cafeteria on the first floor. Each year hundreds of quality clothing items are donated to local charities when they are not retrieved.

#### **Early Release**

If your child needs to be released from school early, please follow these important guidelines:

- Any adult withdrawing a student must show Government issued photo identification.
- In order for your child to be released to anyone other than a parent/guardian, that person MUST be listed as an emergency contact.
- Please send in a note if an early released is planned. Your child will take the note to the Attendance Office first thing in the morning and be issued a pass. This will allow your child to wait to be picked up in the guidance office.
- No child will be released until the adult comes into the building and officially signs the child out. Students with out advance early release passes will only be called down for early dismissal between periods.
- <u>Instructional periods will NOT be interrupted. Please help us avoid interrupting instruction.</u>
