# MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

#### June 7, 2021

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in a regular monthly meeting on Monday, June 7, 2021 at 6:30 pm in the Montgomery County Schools Boardroom. Board members present were Steve W. DeBerry – Chair, Bryan Dozier, Lynn Epps, Cindy Taylor and Jesse Hill. Tommy Blake was absent.

Chairman Steve DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Lynn Epps seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Attached you will find a budget amendment for your consideration for the year ending June 30, 2021.

#### Fiscal Year 2020/2021 Budget Amendment #8

#### **State Funds**

#### A net increase of \$2140.00 to the State Budget Fund (Fund 1):

\$265.00 increase in PRC 085 (Early Grade Proficiency) – This disbursement to Montgomery County Schools represents the unused portion of grant funds that remained after the State's initial allotment.

\$1875.00 increase in PRC 003 (Non-instructional Support) – These funds are to reimburse the district for training expenses.

\$63,980.00 decrease in PRC 013 (CTE employee compensation) and a corresponding increase in PRC 014 (CTE Program Expenses) – Surplus funds in PRC 013 were transferred to PRC 014 so that the funds could be exhausted by year end. No additional funds were received from the State, this is a transfer between the two CTE budgets.

\$540,000.00 decrease to PRC 056 (Transportation) which was offset by an increase of \$65,000.00 to PRC 061 (Supplies) and a \$475,000.00 increase in PRC 003 (Non-instructional Support) – Due to the decreased expenses in transportation costs as a result of the pandemic, the state allowed surplus funds to be transferred from the transportation budget to other state budgets where the funds could be utilized. This will allow the district to redirect expenses to state budgets that were initially paid with local funding. This is not additional funding, only a reallocation of previously received funding.

#### **Local Funds**

2) No change to the Local Fund Budget (Fund 2)

#### **Federal Funds**

3) A net increase of \$4,226,595.00 to the Federal Budget Fund (Fund 3)

\$10,000.00 increase to PRC 026 (Homeless Funds) – This provides funding to purchase clothing for homeless students

\$831.00 increase to PRC 103 (Supportive Effective Instruction) – This disbursement to Montgomery County Schools represents the unused portion of grant funds that remained after the State's initial allotment.

\$2079.00 increase to PRC 050 (Title I) – This disbursement to Montgomery County Schools represents the unused portion of grant funds that remained after the State's initial allotment.

\$3666.00 increase to PRC 163 (CARES Act 2020) – This disbursement to Montgomery County Schools represents the unused portion of grant funds that remained after the State's initial allotment.

\$4,210,019.00 increase to PRC 171 (ESSER II COVID Relief Funding) – This disbursement to Montgomery County Schools represents the district's portion of the Elementary and Secondary Emergency Relief funding.

#### **Capital Outlay Funds**

#### 4) A net increase of \$7212.00 to the Capital Outlay Fund (Fund 4):

\$7212.00 increase to PRC 802 (Capital Outlay) – These funds were used to repair the manhole that collapsed at Troy Elementary that disrupted the water supply.

#### **Child Nutrition**

5) No change to the Child Nutrition Fund. (Fund 5)

#### **Special Local Fund 8**

#### 6) A net increase of \$293,824.35 to the Special Local Budget Fund (Fund 8)

\$284,167.35 increase to PRC 379 (School Climate Transformation Grant) – This represents unspent funds that were carried over from the prior school year for the SCTG grant and added to this year's budget.

\$9657.00 increase to PRC 311 (GEARUP grant) – This represents additional funds received from the GEARUP grant to provide additional learning opportunities at the high school and middle schools.

# 7) Overall, these adjustments resulted in an increase of \$4,529,771.35 to the total 2020/2021 budget for Montgomery County Schools.

Steve DeBerry called upon Dr. Dale Ellis for Policy# 3620 Extracurricular Activities/Student Organizations. Dr. Ellis stated one of the by-products of online learning we have had quite a few kids get jobs or other family responsibilities. These students did all of their work and made passing grades. But for whatever reason had excessive absences. Principals have the ability to waive grades. Those students that have met all criteria for athletics are being caught up in policy# 3620. Dr. Ellis recommends a one-time waiver of that policy during the spring semester only to allow those students to participate in fall sports. Steve DeBerry asked for a motion to approve. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Jesse Hill seconding. The motion carried unanimously with the board.

Steve DeBerry called upon Dr. Dale Ellis for the Appointee to the MCC Board of Trustees. Dr. Ellis recommended Gelynda Capel be reappointed. She has been a long time member and tremendous advocate for the board. Mrs. Claudia Bulthuis requests Mrs. Capel be appointed. Lynn Epps abstained from voting. Steve DeBerry asked for a motion to approve. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Cindy Taylor seconding. The motion carried unanimously with the board.

Steve DeBerry called upon Tracy Grit for policies up for approval. Mr. Grit presented an overview of the forty-eight policies with revisions. Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to approve. Lynn Epps made the motion with Jesse Hill seconding. The motion carried unanimously with the board.
