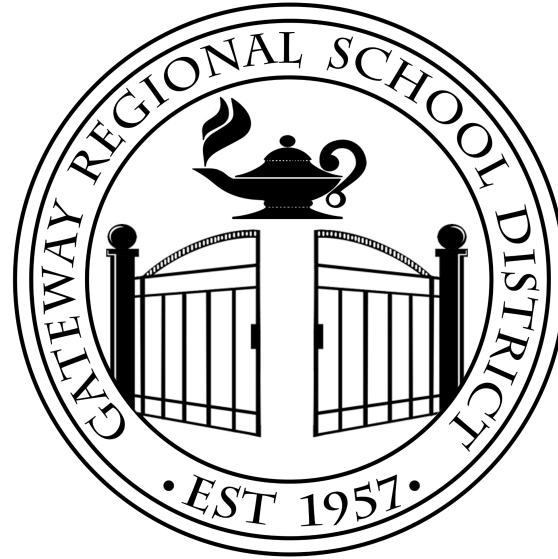

## **Chester Elementary School Improvement Plan**

## School Improvement Plan Executive Summary

Chester Elementary School is a small, rural school located on Middlefield Road in Chester, Massachusetts. Our school serves the towns of Chester, Blandford, and Middlefield, which are residential, rural, and recreational communities situated in the Berkshire foothills of Western Massachusetts. Our school is nestled between a historic railway and the West Branch of the Westfield River. The Westfield River was Massachusetts' first river to receive National Wild and Scenic River designation. Our school is directly next-door to Gobble Mountain and located less than a mile from the Keystone Arches trailhead; two of the stunning keystone arches were recently designated as National Historic Landmarks.

Chester Elementary School is a part of The Gateway Regional School District and is a Title 1 School; our student population consists of 40% of students of low income, 29% of students with disabilities, and 56% of students with high needs. At Chester Elementary School, there is a strong focus on strength based, personalized instruction and exploratory based learning experiences for all students in kindergarten through grade five. Our students receive relevant and quality instruction in the areas of Reading, Math, History, Character Development, Citizenship, Positive Behavior, Social Skills, Bullying Prevention, Science, Technology, Engineering, Financial Literacy, Music, Art, Library, physical education, and Health. We've created strong community partnerships and capitalized on the abundant amount of natural resources, rich culture, and proud history that surrounds our school in order to implement and elevate an agricultural learning pathway that has quickly become an integral part of our school's identity. Students engage in hydroponic gardening, farm to lunch table grow cycles, microgreen planting projects, composting, container gardening, farming partnerships, tree tapping, boiling sap/making & bottling of maple syrup, river study, ecology exploration, walking field trips, and learning centered in our area's history and geology, which is provided by local experts and/or community organizations.

**Chester Elementary School's Mission Statement:** At Chester Elementary School, we believe a meaningful education has the power to shape lives, inspire new ways of thinking, and forge the way forward to a better, brighter future. We are committed to

building community partnerships that serve as catalysts to rich, relevant learning experiences and to empowering our students to push new boundaries of innovation and productivity within a culture of belonging, joy, and high expectations for what students learn and who they become.
