CCSD recognizes Substitute Educators' Day

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Charleston, SC – Since 2013, Charleston County School District (CCSD) has partnered with Kelly Education to ensure that teacher and teacher assistant absences are covered effectively by qualified substitute teachers. In the eleven years that CCSD has worked with Kelly Education, the district has implemented a number of innovative initiatives that have led to increased numbers of substitutes. To date this school year, CCSD has a sub-pool of more than 1,600 individuals - almost double the number the district had prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, CCSD is pleased to announce that there is currently a fill rate of 95 percent.

Whether they report to the same building daily or travel to multiple schools each week, CCSD substitutes are an important part of the district's education system. In honor of Substitute Educators' Day, CCSD recognized two substitutes that are making a difference in students' lives at the Monday, November 18, 2024, Board of Trustees Meeting.

Michael Peter has been employed with Kelly Education as a substitute teacher since 2021. For the past two years, Peter has served at Stiles Point Elementary School as the building substitute.

Muzzetta Young has dedicated the last six years to Kelly Education and CCSD. She has worked diligently at many schools over the years but has found a home at St. James-Santee Elementary-Middle School.
