When absences happen...

Expectation: Bring a note to excuse your absence

- Bring a note to the attendance office within 3 working days or your absence will be unexcused
- Five consecutive absences due to illness require a doctor's note to return to school
- Truancy will have disciplinary consequences and possible legal actions assigned

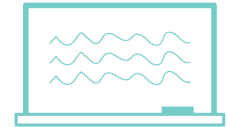
Expectation: Be in class on time!

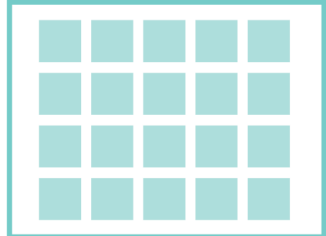


IN THE CLASSROOM

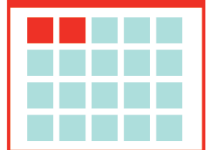

Tardy Policy

- 6-minute passing period
- Music cue & 1-minute warning bell
- 20 minutes late = absent
- Report to Tardy Kiosk
- Give teacher your tardy slip

Tardies	Consequences
1 - 5	Warning
6 - 8	1-hour detention each
9 - 11	2-hour detention each
12 - 14	4-hour detention each
15+	Minimum 1 day ISS each

Excessive Tardies = No Exam Exemptions

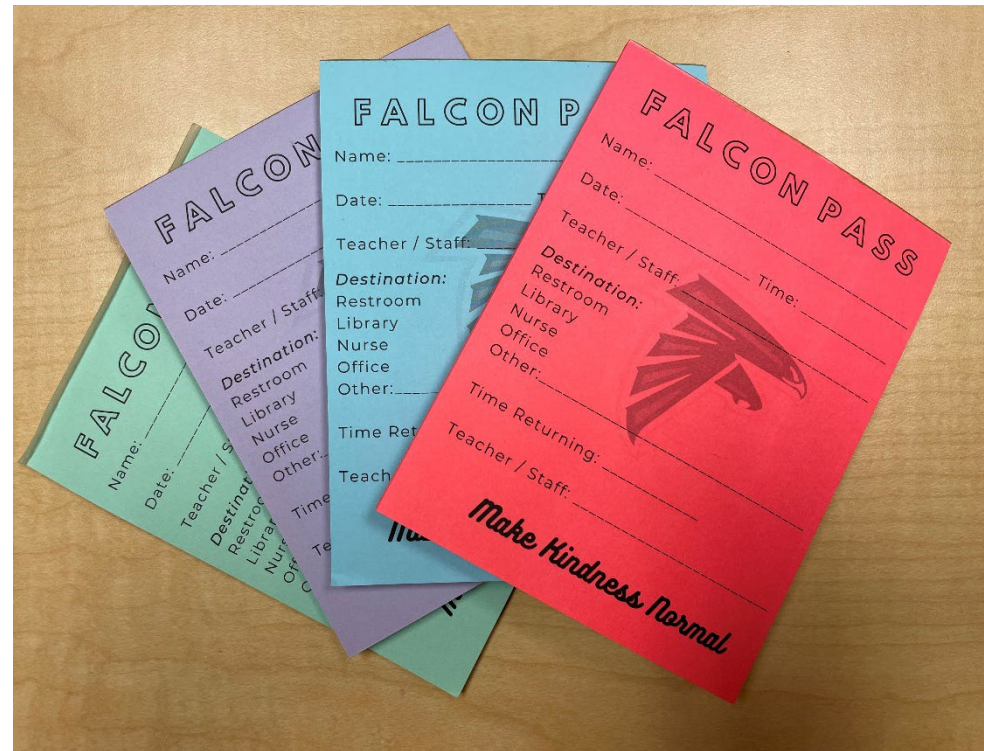
Purposeful false reporting is punishable with discipline consequences.

Hall Passes

School Discipline

Expectation: This is a drug and tobacco free zone

- Tobacco or nicotine products (vapes/e-cig) are illegal on school property (or at school related activities)
- **New law states that ALL vaping devices (THC, Delta 8, and Nicotine) are mandatory placements at DAEP**
- Deputies will be filing charges for any tobacco, drug or alcohol related offenses. FYI- the legal age is 21.
- Deputies continue to file charges on all other criminal offenses on campus or at campus events

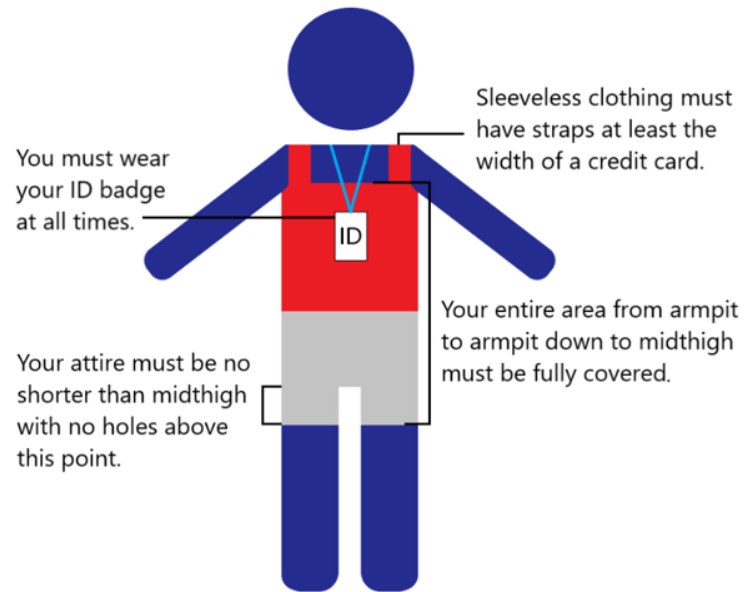

No Hats or Hoodies



You must wear your ID badge at all times.


Sleeveless clothing must have straps at least the width of a credit card.

Your attire must be no shorter than mid thigh with no holes above this point.

Your entire area from armpit to armpit down to mid thigh must be fully covered.

- **ID badges** must always be worn and visible on campus.
 - **Tattoos** must be covered at all times.
 - Do not wear **pajamas, house shoes, or slippers.**
 - No **hats** or **hoodies** may be worn during school hours except for religious head coverings.
 - **Trench coats** or **over-sized jackets** are not permitted.
 - All skirts, shorts, dresses, etc. must be worn **no shorter than mid-thigh.**
 - **Skin-tight pants** must be covered by a shirt long enough to cover the wearer's bottom.
 - **Undergarments** must not be visible.
 - Garments or other items that advertise weapons, alcohol, drugs, or inappropriate activities are not permitted.
 - Garments that can be interpreted as **gang-related** are not permitted and **may result in DAEP placement.**

Student ID Expectation

You MUST have your ID on a lanyard around your neck and visible AT ALL TIMES.

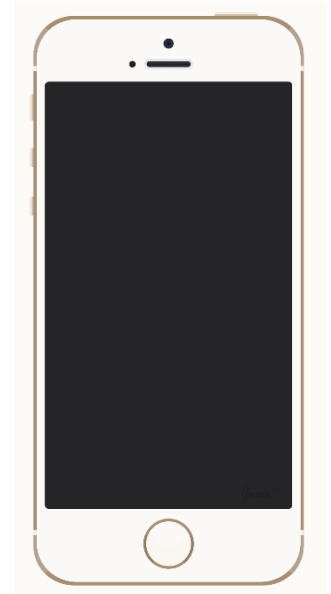

CLHS Responsible Use Guidelines for electronic devices

Expectation: Be responsible with your device

- Report immediately if it is lost or stolen- a report is required within 5 days.
- Take care of your device- you are responsible for its care.
- Your teacher directs the use of technology in the classroom for district AND personal devices. Devices may be confiscated.

- This Honor Code was **developed by Clear Creek ISD high school students**
- We believe that **academic honesty is respecting yourself and others,**
- We believe **students are responsible for maintaining and supporting the academic integrity of the school**

Secondary Honor Code (continued)

KNOW THE
CODE

Consequences:

1. A documented finding of an honor code violation shall be recorded in the student's **discipline record**.
2. A student shall be assigned **in-school suspension** and/or any other applicable consequences listed in the Student Code of Conduct.
3. A student shall receive a **"0" for the school-work**, will not be allowed to retake the work, and is subject to a "U" in conduct and disciplinary action (including ineligibility in the next contest/game)
4. Students who are enrolled in advanced academic courses (Pre-AP/AP) may be removed from the advanced academic course and placed in the **next lower-level class** if the counselor, after consultation with the student and teacher, determines the student is not able to be successful in the advanced academic course.
5. A student is not eligible for any semester exam **exemption**.
6. Students in violation of the Honor Code shall be immediately removed from the National Honor Society, National Junior Honor Society and any other **Honor Society** that is an official school organization
7. A student who has been disciplined for academic dishonesty during the four semesters preceding graduation shall not be eligible to deliver a **speech during graduation ceremonies**. See EIC(LOCAL).

Afternoon Release/Bus Information

- **Buses leave promptly at 2:43 p.m.**
 - Student Code of Conduct apply to students on the bus and at bus stop.
 - You cannot ride home with a friend on their bus unless you get permission AND fill out a form with your principal.
- Students must leave the building after school. Do not loiter in the building after school or by the gym, band hall, or PAC after a practice.
 - If you are waiting for a ride and it is after 2:45pm, you must wait outside.



Deliveries to School...

- Only for school related needs – such as lunch or school items.
 - Food delivery services are not permitted on campus and will be turned away.
- Non-school related items will remain at the front desk until after school.



Medication Expectation



- **ALL** prescription and nonprescription medications to be taken at school must be in its original labeled container and accompanied by a permission note from your parent/guardian to the school nurse.

- Includes: Advil, Tylenol, Robitussin, cough drops, and other over the counter medications.
- If you are carrying meds, it can become a discipline issue

Lockers and Stuff Security



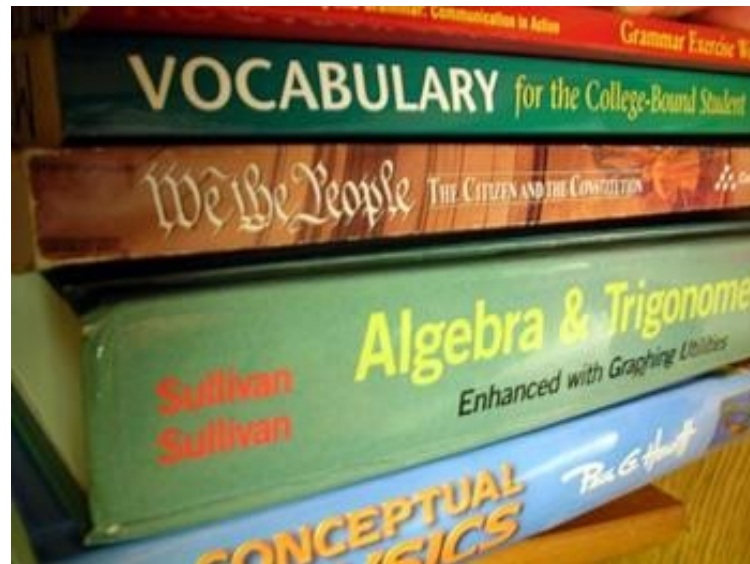
- If you need an academic locker, come to Mrs. Hass office (1060).
- Locker expectations:
 - Keep your personal items secured at all times
 - Do not leave your clothing, wallets, and phone on the floor in a pile, that is NOT secure in athletics/PE locker rooms.
 - **Do not share lockers. What's in there is YOURS.**
 - Don't leave your purse, phone, or backpack unattended.

Check the lost and found if you misplaced something.

Clear Lake is NOT responsible for items left out of lockers or unsecured (INCLUDING LOCKERROOMS).

Textbooks

- Most books are online and you can access them through your Single Sign-On Portal
- See Ms. McBride in office 1060 to request a book.
 - You are responsible for the books that are issued to you.
 - Average cost of one book is \$65. Yikes! AP books are as much as \$180.

Falcon Lunch & School Safety



- Remember Lake is a closed campus. You may not leave campus during lunch and there will be disciplinary action if you do.
- If someone is delivering something for you, they need to bring it to the front office, and you may not wait in the lobby for a delivery.
- Food delivery services will be turned away at the door- they are not allowed on any campus.
- You may not leave the building to meet someone outside.
- No matter the time of day, do not open any doors for anyone! People outside may only enter through the main doors after the school day has started. Discipline action will be taken for anyone opening doors for others.
