

**MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION
MINUTES**

February 3, 2020

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, February 3, 2020 at 6:30 pm at Montgomery County Schools Central Office. Board members present were Steven W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Shirley Threadgill, Bryan Dozier and Sandra Miller. Trikena Simmons was absent.

Chairman Steve DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Shirley Threadgill seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Chairman DeBerry read a devotional titled “The Buck Stops Here.” Reminding us that the buck stops at each of us. We all are responsible human beings every talent we have is a responsibility.

Montgomery Early College Principal, Heather Seawell, Cindy Martin, Teacher and students, Abigail Cristobal Salgado and Elizabeth Loflin presented “MCEC Community Service.” MCEC seeks to graduate students who are well-rounded and know the value of giving back to the community. Student service is vital to helping students stand out when applying for college, scholarships and jobs. MCEC has eleven active student-led clubs and groups that provide opportunities for students to serve the community on and off campus.

Montgomery Learning Academy Principal, Amy Reynolds, Ruby Parsons, Teacher and Craig Jones, Administrative Intern presented “Edmentum.” Edmentum develops courses based on students’ individual needs. Modifications are available for EC, EL, and 504 students. Learning occurs at student’s own pace. Students can work from anywhere, school, home, work, library. Teacher can easily monitor students by recognizable icons that show progress. All students at MLA have taken at least one online course. Mrs. Parsons does CTE courses face to face.

Dr. Ellis presented a condensed summary of the WestEd Report. In this report are recommendations for feedback to State Board of Education. Remove transfer restrictions and restore financial flexibility to local districts; Districts should not be penalized for being financially well-managed. Phase in a weighted student funding formula that accounts for regional differences and necessary adjustments for small schools and low-wealth communities. Increase funding for all positions so that education is an attractive long-term career option like it once was. Increase teacher compensation in a way that enables low-wealth districts to be more competitive with recruitment and retention. Provide additional state incentives for principals to work in high-needs schools. Expand NC Pre-K to make it universal for all 4-year olds. Revise the accountability/assessment model to accurately account for poverty with a focus on measures that truly matter, such as growth. The board approved of the draft summary. Dr. Ellis will proceed with State Board of Education.

Garrett Maynard presented “To This High Moment, Education in Montgomery County.” Mr. Maynard presented the history of Montgomery County Schools buildings from 1865-2019. The end of the Civil War was the beginning of education in Montgomery County as we know it. Mr. Maynard’s through history lesson of the progress education and liberation of slavery took us through the steps of school consolidations that lead us to where we are now. Mr. Maynard’s presentation was very well received by the board of education.

Montgomery County Early College Seal was presented by Heather Seawell. Roy Beaman and students worked together and created two designs for recommendation. The board decided to approve design A the choice of the students. Sandra Miller made the motion to approve design A and Shirley Threadgill seconded.

Policy 4240/7312 Child Abuse – Reports and Investigations was approved by the board. Sandra Miller made the motion to approve Tommy Blake seconded. The board unanimously approved.

Calendar 2020-2021 Options were presented by Dr. Lancaster. The board will discuss options and approve choice in March.

Construction Update presented by Dr. Ellis. The CTE Building is complete and has been occupied since January 24th. The building has been functioning well and the transition was fairly easy. Students were interviewed and all agree that it is an awesome facility. Open House is scheduled for February 25th. The estimated completion date for the main high school building is July 16th. Additional workers may be brought in to ensure the happening. Bill Mingin will continue to supervise so that no shortcuts are taken on quality.

Superintendents Remarks by Dr. Ellis. Dr. Ellis presented each board member with a gift for School Board Appreciation Month. Dr. Ellis thanked each of them for their dedication and hard work.

During closed session, Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. With a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second by Jesse Hill, the meeting was duly adjourned.

The next regular meeting will be held Monday, March 2, 2020 at 6:30 pm at Montgomery County Board of Education boardroom.
