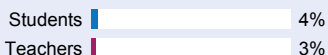

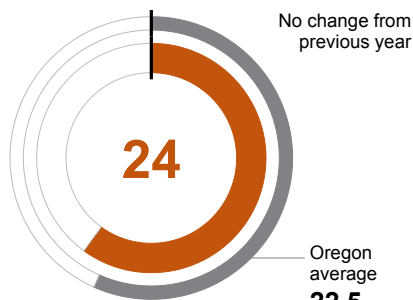

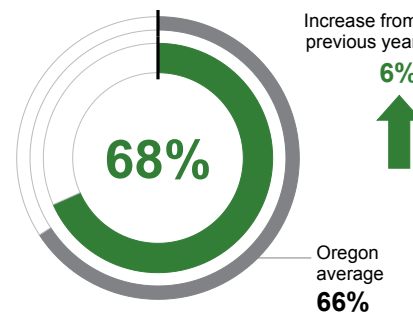

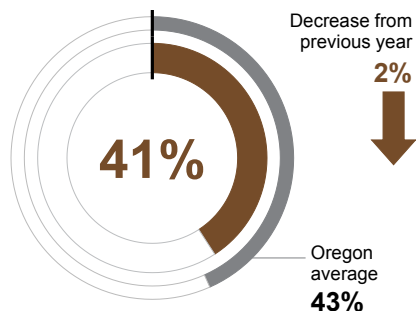

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.

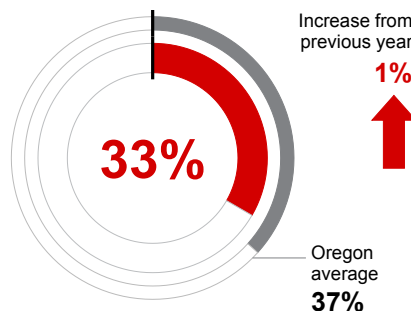

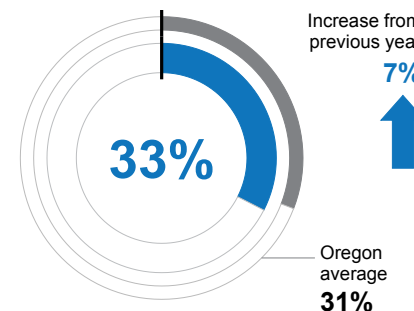
