

- Pilot a **student snapshot** that reflects student strengths and interests, parental aspirations, and student-driven goals.






ELA Academic Performance Indicators



Students Assessed/Total: 379/379




Beginning of the Year Snapshot

- 163 students (43%) in Tier I,
- **162 students (43%)** in *Tier II*,
- 54 students (14%) in Tier III.

Last Year's Diagnostic I Snapshot

- **191 students (50%)** in *Tier I*,
- 151 students (39%) in Tier II,
- 43 students (11%) in Tier III.

Beginning of the Year Snapshot

- **114 students (30%)** in *Tier I*,
- 230 students (61%) in Tier II,
- 35 students (9%) in Tier III.

Last Year's Diagnostic I Snapshot

- **105 students (28%)** in *Tier I*,

- 45 students (11%) in Tier III.

Celebrations

Net Promoter Score @ 65 (40+ considered excellent)

Relative Areas Identified for Improvement

- Students stand up for those bullied @ 80.4%
- 80.4% of students report they have time to discuss concerns
- 34% of students report they have experienced cyberbullying





Enhancing School Connectedness

School Connectedness

- Continue to incorporate student voice & service through student-led groups:
 - Sea Lion Senate, Sea Lion Squad, PALs, RAK Pack, Big Buddies
- Continue to implement Community Circles/Restorative
 Practices to enhance student problem-solving and empathy
- Assign Staff Mentors to to targeted Tier II and Tier III students





Enhancing PBIS & SEL Tier I Instruction

Enhancing PBIS

- Enhancement of student leadership visibility on campus: welcome committee, ambassadors & Peace Path leaders
- Ongoing integration of **digital citizenship** in tech lessons
- Continued daily recognition of students with Seaside Shout-Outs

Strengthening SEL Tier I Instruction

- Pilot online Second Step Program to enhance Tier I
- Inclusion of **Social-Emotional Learning** in daily announcements
- Refinement of roles and responsibilities of Counselor and Student Support Specialist to respond to changing needs of students

Improving Chronic Absenteeism

Identified Need

In 23-24, El Morro <u>reduced</u> Chronic Absenteeism from **22.8%** to **12.3%** through ongoing outreach and collaboration with students and families. This is a decrease of 10.5%

Key Metrics

- Over 275 Communications (phone calls, letters, emails)
- Developed System of Intervention
- Principal Presentations at PTA & SSC Meetings
- Over 37 Collaborative Meetings (SART) and Attendance Contracts
- Currently @ 15 Students w/ Chronic Absenteeism

- Host Parent Education Events events in partnership with FRC and PTA
- Diversify PTA committee and **parent engagement** opportunities
- Offer meaningful Family Events to welcome parents/guardians and community members on campus
- Schedule accessible tours to showcase El Morro campus and programs to New Families
