


Chenev Public Schools Celebrates Native American Heritage Month

Cheney High School Marching Band and Color Guard performed at the Bands of America Grand National Championships November 14-16 at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind., becoming the first Washington state program in history to perform in the national event. The Grand National Championships was the final event of the 2024 season, marking the conclusion of a stellar season with the Electric Sunshine performance.

The Blackhawks joined 112 other high schools from across the country in Indianapolis, performing in both preliminary events on November 14 and November 15. CHS finished 58th in the preliminary events, capping off a spectacular season.

The CHS Blackhawk Band Parent Booster Club was instrumental in making this trip a reality. Several parent volunteers hauled props and equipment from Cheney to Indianapolis, while many others offered support near and far.

Thank you, Cheney Public Schools! As of publication, all ballots in Spokane County have been counted, and the district's \$72 million bond is passing at 62.39%. Final certification will be November 26th.

A whopping 74.32% of registered voters in our district turned out to vote in the November 5th General Election. With the passage of this bond, our district will now have the necessary funding to address growth projects across the district, safety and security upgrades, as well as districtwide student health and facility improvements.
