**Scholarship History:** Dr. Harold Kaiser, an innovative educator and strong advocate for public education, was superintendent of the Davenport Community School District from 1964-1973 during a time of significant social change in the country, Dr. Kaiser believed quality public education provided upward mobility and a chance for a better life for students in the district. John and Kristine Kaiser created this one-time current use scholarship of \$500 in 2023 to honor their father.

**Eligibility:** The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from Central, West, North or Mid-City high schools who plans to major in education.

**Requirements:** Applicants who have significant financial need are given preference.

Application deadline is March 1, on or before 11:59 P.M.

**Award:** This non-endowed scholarship of \$500 is funded by the family and is non-renewable – available for one year only. The award will be announced at the winner’s school award program in May and may vary according to funding.

**Selection Committee:** Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected by members of the Davenport Schools Foundation Scholarship Committee.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
