
Commitment to Fiscal Excellence

The Westlake Council of Parent and Teacher Associations (WCPTAs) is a volunteer umbrella organization supporting the five PTA units within the Westlake City School District. WCPTAs is an affiliate of the National PTA, the oldest and largest association devoted to child advocacy in America. Rooted in this profound mission, WCPTAs is a powerful voice and a reliable resource for families and communities, as well as a strong advocate for the education and well-being of every child in our district.

Each school year, parents, grandparents, and other devoted family members, as well as teachers, school staff, administration, and community partners, channel collective efforts towards the advancement of education, health, and safety for all Westlake students. In the 2023-2024 school year, PTA volunteers contributed over 9,400 service hours to the Westlake community.

With fundraised dollars in 2023-2024, WCPTAs and our PTA units provided \$21,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors and awarded over \$12,000 to staff to fund grants that directly impacted critical curriculum initiatives from Pre-K through grade 12. In addition, in collaboration with district staff, teachers, and community partners, your PTAs invested \$72,609 to provide programs like STEM Fest, a Wellness Fair, Diversity Week, Kindness Run, literacy programs, art shows, Veterans Day events, family fun nights, and more, serving our mission to make every Westlake child's potential a reality.



Being a PTA member provides an invaluable opportunity to connect with other families and school staff. Membership also helps families gain insights into what is going on in the school community, as well as build rapport and discuss issues directly with the change makers. Enhancing Opportunities for Students

The Westlake Educational Foundation (WEF) plays a pivotal role in enhancing educational opportunities for students in the Westlake City Schools. Established in 1987 as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, the Foundation is dedicated to enriching the educational experiences of students in alignment with the district's mission to "Educate for Excellence." Through grant funding, WEF empowers teachers and administrators to implement innovative and creative projects that go beyond the standard curriculum.

Over the past four years, WEF has awarded more than \$68,000 in grants, supporting impactful initiatives such as sensory and enrichment equipment for special needs students, classroom calm kits for stress relief, outdoor learning spaces at DIS and LBMS, pottery wheels at DIS and WHS, and a 3-D printer at WHS.

Westlake Alumni Association Announces 2025 Hall of Fame Inductees



Green and White Review Star



A High-Quality, Inclusive Learning Experience: Inside Our Preschool Program




Our preschool program serves children ages 3-5 with disabilities, offering a nurturing learning environment across six half-day classrooms and one full-day classroom. The program operates Monday through Thursday, with Fridays dedicated to team meetings, play-based evaluations, and community collaboration.

A key feature of our program is the inclusion of typically developing peers, providing role models and fostering an enriching experience for all students. Students engage with Ohio's Early Learning and Development Standards, focusing on social-emotional skills, literacy, math, and science. In addition to classroom activities, students visit the library and participate in music activities.



We serve up to 56 students with disabilities and 44 typically developing peers, and have partnerships with local preschools, including Play and Learn and Best Beginning. Specialized support is provided by our itinerant staff at these locations.



Our program thrives through collaboration with county and community organizations such as Bright Beginnings, Connecting for Kids, and the Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities. These partnerships strengthen our services and provide valuable resources for our students and families. We remain committed to supporting every child's growth and success.



American Flag Dedication at Westlake High School

Growing Minds, Greener Futures

DOVER INTERMEDIATE STUDENTS DRIVE OUTDOOR LEARNING AND SUSTAINABILITY

Students at Dover Intermediate School (DIS) are making a lasting environmental impact through a multi-phase outdoor learning project. Led by teachers Angela Germano and Bridget Royce, the initiative integrates math, science, and real-world problem-solving to create sustainable outdoor spaces.

The project began in 2020 with a native garden, designed and built by students to support local wildlife and to learn about conservation solutions for local pollinators. In the following years, students expanded their efforts by designing a stage, additional pollinator spaces, and a comprehensive outdoor learning area.





Most recently, DIS earned the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Wild Schools designation, and students organized a celebration to educate the community about environmental stewardship.

This hands-on learning experience has been supported by \$25,000 in grants/community partnerships, The Pattie Group, the Westlake City Service Department, and parent volunteers. Students have collaborated across grade levels, worked with high school mentors, and engaged in service projects with the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. Through this initiative, students are not only creating outdoor spaces but also fostering a love for nature and a commitment to sustainability that will benefit the school and community for years to come.
