Our team works diligently to implement our curriculum in the classroom, with small groups, and during individual student meetings. So far this year, counselors have delivered lessons in advisories, Health I classes, during Back to School Night, and during the Academic Programs Open House. We will continue providing lessons throughout the year. Coming up, we will continue academic and career planning with our 11th grade students, provide parent/student sessions during the upcoming Academic Conference night on November 14th, and continue offering individual meetings with our seniors for post-secondary planning.

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### The Anxious Generation

It is no surprise to most that anxiety amongst Gen Z students has been on the rise. What might surprise you is that this increase was not, as most people assume, directly related to the impacts of COVID - 19. In his book, *The Anxious Generation*, Jonathan Haidt does an excellent job providing data to show that the rates of anxiety in the Gen Z population actually took a sharp incline between the years of 2010-2015. Not so coincidentally, this was also when "the smartphone and selfie-based social media ecosystem that we know today emerged" (Haidt, p. 35). Haidt's dichotomy of play-based childhood vs. phone-based childhood is well researched, enlightening, and challenging as a parent and school counselor.

School counselors have teamed up with administration this year to provide parent sessions, lessons/infographics for students, and professional development for our staff based on anxiety and social media use. ### College Application Reminders

Application season is still in full swing. While some Early Action deadlines have passed, there is still ample time to get those application in! Here are some reminders as you either begin or continue working on your applications:

- If you're using Common App, please match that account with your Naviance account and be sure to complete the FERPA waiver.
- Request letters of recommendations from your teachers via Naviance. We ask that teachers are given 2-3 weeks advanced notice to complete these requests.
- Request transcripts via Naviance as needed for applications and/or scholarships.
- Submit applications before your chosen deadlines (you do not need to wait for teacher or counselor documentation to finalize your applications).
- Complete the <u>Self-Reported Student Academic</u> Record as needed.
- Check application portals to ensure all parts of your application have been received.

### **Financial Aid Information**

We are about one month away from the opening of the 25-26 FAFSA. To ensure that our seniors and their families are prepared to apply for financial aid, we are offering a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) Creation Workshop on November 14th at 4:30 and again at 5:30 in the Media Center. During this workshop, students and parents will create their FSA ID which is required to access the FAFSA form. Please ensure that you have the following information with you for this workshop:

- Full Name (as it appears on your Social Security card)
- Date of Birth
- Personal email address
- Social Security Number (if applicable)

We will also be hosing a FAFSA Information Session that same evening, November 14th at 6:00 p.m. in the Auditorium at MVH. A representative from Stevenson University will guide families through the steps and answer questions to help you prepare for FAFSA submission.

### Naviance Spotlight

Did you know that Naviance is for students on all different post-secondary paths? This tool is not just for students planning to go to college as some may think. In fact, students can select which pathway they intend to take - Military, College, Apprenticeship, Employment, etc. to tailor their Naviance experience accordingly.

Throughout the year, students are asked to complete tasks in Naviance through lessons in advisory. For example, this past week, 9th grade students were assigned the Career Cluster Finder which allows them to explore Careers that match their interests and personality. Students in other grades were asked to explore Road Trip Nation, which includes videos from leaders in nearly every industry out there, from Food to Medicine, to Business, to Politics, etc.

The self-discovery tools available in Naviance are akin to those that the career counseling industry utilizes to help folks discover a career that matches their talents, abilities, and passions. We highly encourage students to take advantage of these tools while they can still do so for free!
