MINUTES

November 7, 2011

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, November 7, 2011, at 6:30 p.m. Board members were present as follows:

Chairman DeBerry welcomed back Jesse Hill and called the meeting to order, asking for a motion to approve the agenda as presented. With a motion from Sandra Miller, and a second from Tommy Blake, the agenda was adopted with unanimous approval from the board.

The opening devotional by Chairman DeBerry was from Ephesians, Chapter 5 about being poor but rich in what is important. Giving thanks is paramount. Thanks are the nobler side of all. Those who are not grateful are not worthy. A grateful mind is a joyful mind.

The agenda continued to Principal, John Ward with Montgomery Learning Academy's Operation Graduation. There are several names for their program, Wildcats Den, LA Cubs and there is the after school program. Flex scheduling is offered, along with independent study programs, with some vocational courses. Discipline problems are only a part of the type of study offered at Montgomery Learning Academy. There are partnership programs with Montgomery Community College, NC Mentor, Revival Temple and Wescare Center for children of mothers who are students.

An alternative to suspension program will keep students in school that would ordinarily be out of school. Students are referred from principals, the students work is sent over and the coordinator makes sure the work is done. Attitudes are good and some time is spent talking with the coordinator and John Beard.

The potential goal for graduation is for 60 graduates from Montgomery Learning Academy. Montgomery Learning Academy Student, Courtney Sturdivant transferred from West Montgomery High School. The extra time and smaller classes has improved her grades and given her a better outlook. The new environment has improved her self-image. Student, Taylor Thompson had been falling behind at West Montgomery High School and Montgomery Learning Academy game him more one on one time and has helped him achieve his goals.

Principal Ward presented the Montgomery Learning Academy 2011-2012 ABC Goals. Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to approve, with a motion from Tommy Blake and a second from Ann Long, the board unanimously approved the 2011-2012 ABC Goals.

The agenda progressed to the online testing with Ben Grindstaff giving an update. We are working with students to get used to it. The focus will be better, using a screen versus paper, this system has a built in calculator. The computer will actually read the question aloud to students using headphones. Tests are shorter. This year, biology and English will be done online. It will be fully operational for the year 2013-2014.

Next item is the need for change to public education with Superintendent Ellis saying that we must understand what is happening in American Education and change the game. He will meet with all teachers and teacher assistants to convey what is needed in public schools to be able to provide a quality education to our students. This is a wakeup call to public education.

Kevin Lancaster presented a plan for a qualified observer group to be part of the process in the teachers professional development plan. With a motion from Bryan Dozier, along with a second from Shirley Threadgill, the plan was approved unanimously by the board.

Superintendent Ellis spoke about the school calendar for next year. There are a few different options available. Options of 175 day, 180 days and 185 days will be presented for the boards input and approval at a later time.

Kathy Johnson introduced Dale Smith of Anderson, Smith, and Wike, Montgomery County Schools auditing firm to go over the findings of their latest audit. Overall it went very well, finances are in compliance with state and federal rules. The opinions of finds for finance and fund balance levels are adequate, with concern for the expiring of Federal funds next year. The ABC Waiver flexibility has saved our school system millions of dollars. Only minor things were found.

Outcome from the 2010 Census shows us that some redistricting for Montgomery County Schools must be done. Tharrington-Smith law firm will be working with us to work through this process. We need to schedule a public meeting concerning the redistricting. Kevin Lancaster presented the following policies and regulations for approval. November 28, 2011

The Montgomery County Board of Education met in a special called session on Monday, November 28, 2011, at 6:00 p.m. with the following board members present:

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order. With a motion from Bryan Dozier, along with a second from Shirley Threadgill, the board unanimously approved the agenda as presented.

Superintendent Dale Ellis introduced attorney, Deborah Stagner with Tharrington-Smith law firm. Attorney Stagner has been contracted to coordinate the Montgomery County Schools redistricting needed because of the 2010 Census data. Each district must be equal plus or minus 10% for each district. Right now our overall deviation is 27%. This board is the only approval needed to make the adjustments. A resolution should be made before the next opening of public filing which will be in February, 2012. The board will vote on the redistricting at the January, 2012 meeting which will have a public portion before the regular meeting. An update will be given at the December 5, 2011 Montgomery County Board of Education meeting answering questions.

Attorney Stagner will send us the proposed redistricting electronic files so that overlays can be made to more clearly see the boundaries and changes. Copies that were presented did not have towns or streets were not clear enough, so further information will be forth coming. We will use the county GIS system to help clarify things.

With a motion from Bryan Dozier, and a second from Sandra Miller, the meeting was duly adjourned by Chairman Deberry to meet again for the regular meeting on Monday, December 5, 2011, 6:30 p.m.
