MINUTES

December 3, 2012

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, December 3, 2012, at 6:30 p.m. Board members were present as follows:

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to approve the agenda as shown. With a motion from Sandra Miller, and a second from Jesse Hill, the agenda was adopted with unanimous approval from the board.

Opening remarks by Chairman DeBerry were about the other benefits of Christmas. This is the time to think more about giving, to appreciate those you love and care for. It is time to forgive or apologize if you are wrong, to relive again some joys with old friends, do for others, and enjoy the beauty of the earth and this special time. The simple old truths are still relevant in today's world.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Page Street Elementary Students, Brooke Chappell and Chase Chappell.

The meeting was then turned over to Montgomery County Clerk of Superior Court, Wayne Wooten to swear in the re-elected board members, Steve DeBerry, Ann Long, and Shirley Threadgill. They were duly sworn in.

The meeting was then turned over to Montgomery County Board Attorney, Max Garner to chair the election of 2012-2013 Montgomery County Board of Education Officers. Anne McLean, Principal of Page Street Elementary, spoke on what Page Street Elementary is involved in. PLC's are the way to educate students. PDSA is the way of today. Parent involvement is a large part of our school year. Page Street even added a goal this year for parent involvement. Success is apparent so far. We have had bring your parent to school day, with 106 parents attending. Community Partnerships have expanded. Students came to a Montgomery County Commissioners meeting with the students actually working with a commissioner during that time. A trial of single gender classes in some areas are going very well with teachers going to training to show the different ways of learning between boys and girls. Also being used this year is a looping class where a teacher moves with the students up a grade level. It was discussed with parents first and so far it is working beautifully. This teacher and students have no learning curve as they all know each other well. Professional development from within is happening. At each faculty meeting someone presents something that they have received training on or what their best practices are. Predictive assessments are promising.

Superintendent Ellis gave the board dates to consider for the midyear review. Based on feedback from the board another date is tentatively considered, Thursday, February 21, 2013 from 6pm – 9pm. This will be confirmed on everyone's feedback. No action item for this time is needed.

Superintendent Ellis went on to discuss the Kentucky Accountability Model with their accountability figures in testing associated with the Common Core which went down considerably for elementary students. Department of Public Instruction put out these new guidelines 2 years too soon before more data was available. With numbers going down as was shown in Kentucky it is painful and does not show positive steps otherwise taken. We are telling parents to prepare them for this learning curve in figures. We received some good feedback at the community advisory meeting. The quality of our teachers and PDSA will hopefully not have as much impact as other areas. We want our teachers to know it is not their fault.

The full report from AdvancED was received. It highlights and aligns with Montgomery County Schools strategic plan that allows for flexibility to stay on top of student needs. Opportunities for improvement with a parent engagement plan in each school, a digital learning plan, more support staff, we have been so lean, with everyone being spread as far as they can. One item that was repeated from 5 years ago was to share the strategic plan with the public. Use the technology that we spend money on. This will be part of discussions with principals with how this impacts student achievement. Technology training will be part of the cycle of continuous improvement. Overall, Superintendent Ellis is thrilled with the report. Several points of concern were voiced by board members. Shirley Threadgill is concerned about the numerous ways that we have to learn to teach our children. Ann Long asked about the 2's on the report. She also wanted to know if we could do sensitivity training. With refreshers with technology, sensitivity training and more experience in technology in general will Common Core be easier? The answer is yes it will.

The next area by Superintendent Ellis is the presentation on the student achievement data analysis. There are two goals of any school system, one goal is to raise all achievement, the other, is to close the achievement gap. As groups go up and down, you will see other things. Look at the school improvement gaps. If you have an ongoing problem, then the PLC's are working together. PDSA, data driven decision daily, when looking at the data, African American data is going up for the achievement and down for EOG data. Once the PLCs continue to work, these numbers will be continuing. If we continue with the parent engagement part, with all school improvement plans focusing on reading and math, we will continue to work on this gap. Proficiencies are increasing. High Schools have implemented the PDSA's this year. Trust in our people to get improved proficiencies in all schools. We will work on that gap. It seems that it is a one year fluctuation. The strategy for improving student achievement is PDSA process. It is counterproductive to teachers to do otherwise. The fact to be reminded of is that PDSA is being done with all students. We must have family and student engagement. We want that process to happen in order to engage the other part of the process. The students will tell the teacher what works and what doesn't work. What can we do for the students that are not interested? They will not be left behind if they are engaged. We will get better. We will have courageous conversations with principals with accountability being stressed.

Superintendent Ellis presented a Resolution On Sequestration that will be sent to our representatives in Washington DC. If this present path is followed through, it would cut 10% Federal funding or \$1.2 million dollars from our yearly budget for Montgomery County Schools. With a motion from Bryan Dozier, along with a second from Tommy Blake, the board unanimously approved this resolution.
