Vance Thomas, Principal of Troy Elementary, spoke on what the Reading Mastery Program at Troy Elementary is all about. He asked Anne Evans, Instructional Facilitator, and Tammy Batten, Exceptional Children Lead Teacher to show how they use the program. The Reading Mastery program allows each exceptional child 45 minutes per day to focus on reading. All students with exceptionalities in reading were given the Mastery pretest. Students placing in the program were on different levels within the Kindergarten curriculum. The phonic approach is used as research shows this to be better than a meaning-emphasis approach. It is strategy-based, is intensive, explicit, systematic with careful scaffold lesson that build confidence and independence. There are 160 lessons in the kindergarten Reading Mastery Curriculum. 12 out of 18 students are now proficient on lesson 80 of the kindergarten students. Next steps with the program, is to continue it with exceptionality students, give training in Reading Mastery and then to use Reading Mastery as a supplemental intervention program for students not in the Exceptional Children's program.

Phillip Brown, Secondary and CTE Director presented on Montgomery County's Career Clusters, Public Safety, Fire Academy. Only 12 schools in North Carolina were chosen to be in this pilot program. The overall public safety course provides basic career information in public safety including corrections, emergency and fire management, security and protection, law enforcement and legal services. Students will develop a personal plan for a career in public safety. Work based learning strategies appropriate for this course include job shadowing. No apprenticeships or cooperative education are available for the Fire Technology Course. Enrollment at EMHS is 49 students.

Nelson Furr gave an energy management update for 2011-2012. Overall Montgomery County Schools showed a 24% savings. Human behavior counts for 50-60% of saving costs associated with conservation of energy. Areas that help to achieve savings is educating personnel, and maintenance quick response to immediate energy things like leaks which can be found by monitoring bills on a monthly basis. Awareness of energy perimeters and how we can make changes to save funds is key to this ongoing cost savings. The dollar amount is \$319,891 or 6 teacher's salaries.

Kevin Lancaster presented the 2013-2014 Montgomery County School Calendar for first reading. A committee from all schools was used to put this together. It has been posted online and comments from all personnel are being taken. This will be voted on at a future Montgomery County Board of Education meeting.

Kevin Lancaster presented the following policies for final approval. With a motion from Tommy Blake, along with a second from Sandra Miller these policies were unanimously approved by the board.
