#### MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

### MINUTES

### March 4, 2013

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, March 4, 2013, at 6:30 p.m. Board members were present as follows:

Steven W. DeBerry, Chair Tommy Blake, Vice Chair Bryan Dozier Jesse Hill Ann Long Sandra Miller Shirley Threadgill

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to approve the agenda as shown, with the change to approve the consent agenda after the closed session. With a motion from Ann Long, and a second from Shirley Threadgill, the agenda was adopted with unanimous approval from the board with this change.

Opening remarks by Chairman DeBerry were about friendship. Friendship is the golden strand that holds humans together. It is not proud, it is loyal in adversity, it is a shining jewel in happy days.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Green Ridge Elementary Students, Ladaris Perry and Janet Sanchez.

With no one signing up to address the board, the meeting proceeded to the recognitions.

Montgomery County Schools awarded its Community Partnership Award to Macedonia Presbyterian Church. They have provided supplies for the teachers, baskets of candy with notes of encouragement. Montgomery County Schools thanks you!

Regional Science Fair Winners Advancing to State Level are Iris Johnson – Page Street Elementary, and David Steed – Candor Elementary. Honorable Mentions are Raul Sierra-Jaimes – Green Ridge Elementary, and Colin Cleveland – Star Elementary. Congratulations to all.

Next to be recognized is the Montgomery County Schools Spelling Bee Winner - Kaylin Parter - West Middle School. Also recognized were the schools winners and Montgomery County Schools Spelling Bee Participants; Cristian Munoz - Candor Elementary School, Bryanna Gardner - Mt. Gilead Elementary School, Kaylin Parter - West Middle School, Taylor Jones - Page Street Elementary School, and Levi Sells - Star Elementary School.

Youth Leadership Montgomery County students who were not at the previous Board of Education meeting were recognized.

Green Ridge Elementary was the school highlighted this month. Principal Donna Kennedy introduced Lead EC Teacher, Angela Dawkins-Greene and EC Teacher, Literacy Facilitator and NCSIP Coordinator, Patrice Monroe who gave a presentation on corrective reading. Students are given immediate feedback on their needs. This program is designed to accelerate students at risk. It is used at 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and above and students are being helped by this program. Students are pleased and so are parents.

Sue Hatley then spoke on implementing school performance grades. The state board will meet soon and what has been in place might change again. Expectations were raised significantly in 2012 and 2013. We could see meaningful differentiation but have everything on a level playing field. We could see EVAAs growth, Standard 6 for teachers, but also equity for public charter schools.

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Phillip Brown then presented the survey results for past East and West High School graduates. Strengths were: exposure to online learning which gave financial savings, ROTC provided discipline, career and tech education and SEED were positive. Weaknesses were: more on financial literacy, career and college planning, higher level math classes, scholarship and college financing options, differentiation, rigor and toughness of classes. Opportunities are: financial literacy, career and college planning, higher level math classes, college financing, differentiation PDSA, more rigor, common core and PDSA. We will continue to gather feedback from graduates to guide improved direction.

Superintendent Ellis presented a change to add High Ethical Standards and Service and Safety Driven to the core Value and Strategic Plan. With a motion from Bryan Dozier along with a second from Sandra Miller along with unanimous approval from the board, this was approved.

Next Superintendent Ellis proposed having an Ethics PDSA. With a motion from Bryan Dozier, along with a second from Shirley Threadgill, the board unanimously approved this addition.

Kevin Lancaster brought forth the 2013-2014 Montgomery County School Calendar for approval. With a motion from Tommy Blake with an amendment to add a footnote which adds Saturdays in lieu of snow days, along with a second from Sandra Miller, the 2013-2014 school calendar was approved unanimously by the board as shown below after the consent agenda items.

Next to be brought forth for approval are the policies shown below. With a motion from Tommy Blake, along with a second from Ann Long and with unanimous approval from the board, these policies were approved.

Superintendent Ellis's gave the following remarks.

"Recently, the school system has had to deal with a series of unforeseen and unfortunate ethical lapses by employees. Dealing with such matters is very troubling and difficult to explain. Some matters simply defy explanation. Yet, it is our duty to deal with them. Ethical issues with employees draws into question the trust of the community more so than anything else we have to deal with. We want the public to trust us, to trust our handling of these difficult matters, and to trust us when we say that safety is a top priority. As I have mentioned before, as a father, I can assure you that I take this matter to heart.

I have often told the Board of Education that our school system is a very defensive place. I do not say this for it to be taken as a bad thing. But some of our people often struggle with constructive criticism and some do not feel that improvement is possible in certain circumstances. As a matter of personal responsibility, I think improvement is always possible. I try to lead by example when talking about improvement. I know I have improvement to make in many areas and most of the battle is won when acknowledgement is granted that there is an issue and it needs to be fixed.

The issue with ethical lapses needs to be fixed. No stone was left unturned to ascertain if other employees knew about these latest incidents. After a thorough investigation I do not think so. It is possible that other students knew about it, so it is imperative to me that we build a culture that will report such incidents so they can be handled. I can assure you that we handle such incidents...in closed conjunction with law enforcement.

Max and I are continuing with our ethics training at all schools. As witnessed in our ethics PDSA tonight, that is just the first of many steps we will be taking. When you look at the newspapers across this state, you see a growing trend that is very troubling to everyone. We see it in all areas of society, people in positions of trust who do things that are wrong. I was talking to a school last week and pointing out the multiple instances of school employees that had ethical violations but also the financial advisory that stole from clients and the church treasurer that embezzled money...all positions of trust that violated that trust. As a school system, we cannot afford to have ethical incidents anymore. We must regain the trust of our community.

We do have a totally separate but related cultural issue that we must also acknowledge. I am by no means seeking to blame anyone, but we do have a culture among some young people that says that sexual activity at a young age is ok. We have the data that shows that we are number 2 per capita in the state in the number of teenage pregnancies. We have worked with the Health Department on a grant to work on this issue, but they recently withdrew from providing this service for some reason. The data suggests that ignoring the problem is the last thing we need to do. There is much more work to be done on this issue so we, as a school system, will pick it up. A goal was added to our Strategic Plan tonight. We must identify ways to stem that tide. We have a culture where it is taboo to talk about sexual activity and apparently to report it even if one knows it is wrong. Simply put, that has to stop.

We have covered much tonight that we will be doing in this school system to deal with reculturing our school system. Ethical behavior by our employees will be one of our top values. I will see to that if I do nothing else. I have been very focused on instruction and facilities this year, but, I have the ability to focus on these cultural issues as well. Part of being a person of integrity begins with acknowledging that a problem exists and accepting responsibility for it. The drive to get past defensiveness starts at the top and I hope to lead by example on this issue. As Superintendent, the buck stops with me. I accept responsibility for the recent lapses in ethical conduct by our employees. And I accept full responsibility in doing everything that I can to fix it."

With a motion from Bryan Dozier, along with a second from Jesse Hill, the board unanimously approved going into closed session to discuss personnel.

Upon reconvening, Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. With a motion from Bryan Dozier and a second from Sandra Miller, the board unanimously approved the information as follows.
