### What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federally funded education program providing supplemental resources to schools that meet the eligibility requirements. Funding is to be focused solely on improving students academic achievement.

#### These dollars are used to:

- •identify students experiencing academic difficulties and provide assistance to help these students;
- •purchase additional staff, programs, materials, and/or supplies; and
- •conduct parent and family engagement meetings, trainings, events, and/or activities.

All schools in Florence 1 will receive Title I funding for the 2023-2024 school year.

#### How does our school use Title I funds?

- We developed a Schoolwide Program, which means we plan to spend our funds on the following:
  - Classroom Teachers
  - Two Parenting Workshops
  - Student Incentives
- These items were determined to be needs by the School Improvement Council and were the
  indicated as areas of concern on our Fall/Spring Parent & Teacher Surveys that were returned last
  school year.

- •ensure regular two-way meaningful communication between family members and staff, to the extent practicable, in a language family members can understand.

### Parents Right to Know

All teachers at Southside Middle School meet state certification requirements.

Parents/Guardians in South Carolina have the right to learn about the following qualifications of their child's teacher: state certification requirements for the grade level and content areas taught, the current licensing status of your child's teacher, and baccalaureate/graduate certification/degree.

You may also request the qualifications of an instructional paraprofessional who serves your student in a Title I program or if your school operates a school wide Title I program. Parents/Guardians may request this information from the building principal.

Additionally, Florence 1 Schools ensures that parents will be notified in writing if their child will be taught by a teacher who does not meet certification requirements for 4 or more consecutive weeks.
