MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

December 5, 2016

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, December 5, 2016 at 6:30 p.m. Board members present were Steven W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Ann Long, Bryan Dozier, Shirley Threadgill and Sandra Miller.

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. With a motion by Ann Long and a second from Sandra Miller, the agenda was adopted as presented.

Chairman DeBerry opened with a devotional reading.

Page Street Elementary students Ella Rose Thompson, Shun Chambers and Amaya Britt led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Page Street Elementary School Principal Sharon Castelli, introduced teachers Nora Beasley, Carol Mosley and Joanna Frego to discuss using Blended Spaces, See Saw and QR Codes in the classroom. Students Ella Rose Thompson, Shun Chambers and Amaya Britt helped with the presentation.

Dr. Ellis discussed with the board the STEAM Memorandum of Understanding between Montgomery County Schools and Montgomery Community College, to outline responsibilities. Bryan Dozier made a motion to approve the memorandum as presented. Sandra Miller seconded, with complete member approval.

Next, Superintendent Ellis presented a brief power point on the new high school process. With funding being secured by the USDA, the committee is currently exploring interim financing options. The USDA will assume the loan at project completion. Town Hall meetings were presented in all five towns. There, feedback on wants and desires of the new high school were gathered. Architect selection has begun. The committee will interview seven firms and tour their facilities over a three-day span. The Core Committee expects to select an architect no later than December 30. A "Design Committee" made up of around forty school employees has been assembled to work closely with the selected architect. This committee consists of teachers and personnel from all school departments. The committee has two or three meetings scheduled in January to finalize the design.

Dr. Ellis then updated the board on the East Middle wing addition. He explained that the wing is in the basic planning phase. The board had expressed some concerns over door and bathroom placement, which will be submitted to DPI for review.

Kevin Lancaster, Deputy Superintendent presented several policies for approval. These policies were recommended by NCSBA. Policy numbers 1310/4002 Parental Involvement, 1320/3560 Title I Parent and Family Engagement, 1400 Governing Principle- School Initiatives, 1800 Governing Principle- Stewardship of Resources, 3460 Graduation Requirements, 3620 Extracurricular Activities and Student Organizations, 4003 Translating Policies for Students and Parents, 4040/7310 Staff-Student Relations, 4100 Age Requirements for Initial Entry, 4110 Immunization and Health Requirements for School Admission, 4120 Domicile or Residence Requirements, 4125 Homeless Students, 4135 Tuition for Discretionary Admissions, 4150 School Assignment, 4700 Student Records, 5000 Schools and the Community, 5022 Registered Sex Offenders, 5027/7275 Weapons and Explosives Prohibited, 7130 Licensure, 7241 Drug and Alcohol Testing of Commercial Motor Vehicle Operators, 7430 Substitute Teachers, 7810 Evaluation of Licensed Employees, 7811 Plans for Growth and Improvement of Licensed Employees, 7820 Personnel Files, 9110 Use and Selection of Architects, Engineers, Surveyors and Construction Managers at Risk, 9400 Sale, Disposal, and Lease of Board-Owned Real Property, 3225/4312/7320 Technology Responsible Use, 4333 Weapons, Bomb Threats, Terrorist Threats and Clear Threats To Safety, 4335 Criminal Behavior, 6306 School Bus Idling, 6524 Network Security, 7425 School Administrator Contracts, 7130-R Licensure. Ann Long made the motion to approve with Sandra Miller seconding. These policies were approved with unanimous approval from the board.

Dr. Lancaster also presented policy code 3565/8307 Title I Comparability of Services, for first reading. These policies will be listed for approval at the January meeting.

Superintendent Ellis reminded us to support Tree of Hope this year and to remember those less fortunate during this holiday season.

Before closing, Bryan Dozier applauded Dr. Ellis who was chosen as the North Carolina School Based Health Alliance Superintendent of the Year.

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to adjourn and move into closed session to discuss personnel. With a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second from Sandra Miller, the board unanimously approved going into closed session.
